Guest speaker, Russell Johnson a Senior Lecturer in visual communication design at Deakin University, provided a great overview of design, particularly how influential indigenous art and design has been in Australia and overseas. A particular insight was the use (un authorized) of Aboriginal art on the one dollar bill. Permission to use the design wasn't asked of the artist David Malangi and it is a burial scene. The artwork depicts the 'mortuary feast' of one of the artist's creation ancestors, Gunmirringu, the great Ancestral Hunter. The Manharrngu people attribute this story as the origin of their mortuary rites



Russell also spoke about redesign of the Australian Flag, perhaps to coincide with recognition of the first inhabitants of Australia.

A problem with the current flag is that it's "a darn good looking flag!!'



Blueberries to the rescue

In a review of the wide scope of health issues, two that lie at the root of health conditions are a lack of immune cells and a stiffening of the blood vessels.

When our immune system is deficient in the natural killer T- cells, the body can be subjected to a variety of autoimmune disorders. Without enough of these natural T – cells, a minor infection can turn to disaster. When our blood vessels become stiff, they are not able to pump as much blood around the body. This leads to hypertension.

Both of these conditions can be helped, dare I say reversed, by a number of natural strategies, but one of the more delicious strategies comes in the form of eating blueberries.

In a small study published in the January 8, 2015 issue of the *Journal of Nutrition and Dietetics*, 48 middle-aged pre-hypertensive women, who ate a cup of fresh blueberries every day for 8 weeks, showed a 5 to 6% drop in blood pressure. This percentage drop is significant when compared to blood pressure medications and other types of interventions. In addition, arterial stiffness went down by 6.5%. The researchers also found that blueberries significantly increased the number of T-cells after 6 weeks.

This study, although statistically small, shows that eating blueberries helps reduce the risk of a heart attack in post-menopausal women. The co-authors do not suggest that blueberries should replace hypertension medication but might offset a tendency towards rising blood pressure and stiffening blood vessels that raises women's heart disease risk.
