We had another busy weekly meeting last week, with and Sparsh Abuja and Tiger Liu talking about their inspiring initiative to create conversations around issues of importance to 16 to 18 year olds, and Malcolm and Elizabeth Baird presenting on the scourge of modern day slavery. Having lost his voice, Malcolm battled on with the assistance of Elizabeth and a video on the topic that had been shown at the Rotary International Convention in Seoul earlier this year. We are grateful to them for making their important presentation under most difficult circumstances.

I summarised highlights from a Board meeting held earlier in the week. A great achievement has been the timely completion of the 2015/2016 accounts, and my thanks to David de Garis and for super efforts by Adrian Ranson, Treasurer Greg Cribbes and our new pro bono auditors Baumgartners.

This week we have received funding from the Federal Government towards the purchase of a new BBQ trailer and coffee machine. We have authorised the trial of water filtration equipment in the Minh Hac kindergarten, Primary School and Secondary School and begun planning for another container for the Solomon Islands.

I am personally very grateful to Peter Elliott who has agreed to take over the coordination of our Rotary Gardens Project. Geoff Haddy and Greg Cribbes, with constant assistance from Brian Hurnard, have done a great job this year and the club has received continuing thanks from the Boroondara community for our assistance at properties occupied by older and disabled residents.

We still need a second host family from January to March for our shared international exchange student Moritz Ellermann. Please see Bronwen or Estelle if you can help.

Planning is well underway for two key fund-raising events, our Christmas raffle and our club Golf Day on 10 February next year.

Our thoughts are with members Paul Fitz and Geoff Haddy who are on the injured list at present - we wish them both a speedy recovery.

My holiday will have started by the time this Grapevine goes to press and you will be in the capable hands of Bill Oakley and Jane Pennington over the next six weeks. (Rowan will not be reflecting for a while, but there might be the occasional travel update).

Let's continue the strong performance of this club in doing its part towards Rotary Serving Humanity!

Mr. Malcolm Baird: Rotary Action Group Against Child Slavery



Rotarian Action Group Against Slavery



After attending the Rotary International Convention in Birmingham in 2009 Malcolm began exploring the subject of slavery in todays world, and feels Australian Rotarians could further assist the plight of millions subject to slavery and child slavery.

There are around 45 million people around the world living in slavery, four times the number of slaves involved in the total cross-Atlantic slave-trade of the 1800's.

We saw an outstanding video of a speech at a Rotary Conference by <u>Gary Haugen CEO of the International Justice Commission</u>, which provided some encouragement for future opportunities to reduce slavery, and we need to remember that some

of our Club programs do have some impact in reducing the need for people to end up in slavery.

Malcolm is a retired Finance Director, PHF and is a member of the R C Brighton North.

Geoff's Health Tip

Marijuana is dangerous to Adolescents



Are you amazed to find that marijuana (cannabis) is the most widely used illicit drug in Australia, and that Australia has one of the highest marijuana prevalence rates in the world? A reported one-third of all Australians aged 22 or older (33.5% or about 5.8 million) have tried marijuana and one million have used it in the past year. Although recreational marijuana use is illegal in Australia, according to Wikipedia "the country has largely avoided a punitive drug policy, focusing on harm minimisation strategies and a treatment framework embedded in a lawenforcement regime".

Whilst we have known about marijuana (pot) for many years, it

is only recently that its medical use has become more newsworthy. Medicinal marijuana has been shown to benefit people with certain neurological diseases such as epilepsy and hyperactivity. On 24 February 2016, Australia legalised medicinal marijuana at the federal level; but, as we all know, this alone eventually opens up avenues of supply for general use of marijuana.

Emerging evidence suggests that adolescents may be particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of marijuana use. A clinical review conducted by the National Institute of Drug Abuse has reported that drugs such as marijuana are powerful disrupters of brain programming because they can directly interfere with neural pruning and brain connectivity. This kind of interference can impair behavioral adaptability, mental health and lifestyle that contribute to mental health problems seen as adolescents age into adulthood.

Recently I was talking to a nurse (with his wife who is also a nurse) who worked at a drug rehabilitation centre in Melbourne. He told me that his wife was continually physically abused by young adults whose brains were affected by marijuana. She frequently came home with bruises on her body from these attacks. I was shocked that anyone responsible for the care of those who use illicit drugs should suffer this kind of abuse – all the more essential to educate adolescents in the dangers of drug abuse.

Life Education mobile centres started 35 years ago as a Rotary project in NSW. While more are needed, there are now 100 mobile units Australia-wide with 95 trained educators teaching children from 3 to 17 years to make safer and healthier choices.


