Geoff's Health Tip

Natural Treatment for Rheumatoid Arthritis

Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA) is a painful and debilitating disease that can lead to a substantial loss of mobility and



function, if not adequately treated. Its origins are unclear but most researchers now believe it originated in the northern hemisphere and not Egypt, as previously thought. About 2% of the Australian population is affected by RA, of which 70% are women. Interestingly, most women contract RA in their 60s and 70s.

Standard treatment often involves the use of pharmacological painkillers and anti-inflammatory drugs, as well as natural treatments with fish and krill oils. All of these treatments have their proponents and have varying degrees of success over time.

Recently, a highly promising study published in the journal *Phytotherapy Research* identified a safe and effective natural treatment using Curcumin, the active component in Turmeric which gives this root its bright, saffron-coloured hue.

In this study, forty-five patients diagnosed with RA were randomised into three groups with patients receiving Curcumin (500mg), a recognised anti-inflammatory drug Diclofenac (50mg), and one control group. The endpoint of the study showed evidence of safety and superiority of Curcumin treatment in patients with active Rheumatoid Arthritis.

This is not the first time I have mentioned the <u>use of Turmeric, and its primary ingredient Curcumin</u>, in a wide range of disease prevention and treatment. Other uses of Curcumin include its use as an anti-inflammatory, and in ameliorating Alzheimer's disease.
