As you know, in the New Year District 9800 will be conducting three Rotary Showcases in the first half of 2017. The first is in Bendigo on Australia Day, the second in Melbourne on Saturday 25 February and the third will be in Echuca over the June Queens Birthday weekend.

The objective of the Rotary Showcase concept is to provide an exposition of the wide breadth of Rotary service contributions to the local and international communities, at busy public venues so that the community better understands and recognises what we do. Hopefully this will result in more enquiry about being involved in Rotary, either as a project partner or member of a club. This is a special initiative that I have asked Ian Salek and his dedicated committee to manage, and they have worked very hard at bringing this together. The first two of these events will be held very early in the new year, so before we close for Christmas, I am seeking your support by making sure your club members are aware of what is happening.

Along with thirty or so expo marquees, we want a strong turnout of Rotarians wearing whatever Rotary branded gear they have. I therefore ask that you pass on to every member of your club, my invitation to come along and bring their friends to one or more of these showcases. The Bendigo event will run from 9 am through to 3 pm. The Melbourne event at Federation Square Atrium will run from 9 am until 5 pm, with a build up to some very special things happening at midday, as we use this day to celebrate Rotary's 112th anniversary, so we would like to see as many Rotary faces as possible between 11 am and 1.00 pm. More information in relation to Echuca will follow in due course.




