#### ABBA is coming to town!



Brush your vocal cords and let the dancing begin!





#### **Geoff's Health Tips**

#### What is the difference between hemp and marijuana?

This is an interesting topic, as hemp and marijuana become more frequently discussed in the public domain. Thanks to nearly 80 years of prohibition, public knowledge on hemp and marijuana is limited to rumors and misinterpretations. Hemp refers to strains of *Cannabis sativa* that have been bred specifically for fiber used for clothing, reinforcement of plastics, oils and topical ointments. This strain is known as industrial hemp, and its oil is a very good source of omega-3 fats.

Other strains of hemp contain potent cannabinoids, the most common of which is THC.



THC is the infamously intoxicating hallucinogen, which gave rise to prohibition of <u>all strains</u> of hemp. Incidentally, marijuana is a slang term introduced by Californians as a way to instill fear of pot-smoking Mexicans. Technically, medicinal hemp contains many cannabinoids that have well researched medicinal properties.

The divider between hemp for industrial use and medicinal use is then one of concentration of these cannabinoids. Industrial Hemp contains less than 10 parts per million of THC whilst medicinal hemp, which we might commonly call marijuana, contains considerably more, plus a greater variety of cannabinoids, depending on the species.

About 20 years ago I imported 200 litres of hemp oil from Canada, on the basis that it would be a valuable addition to our range of edible omega-3 oils. The ratio of omega-3 to omega-6 polyunsaturated fatty acids made it ideally suitable for oral use and the THC content was exceptionally low. Whilst the drum was en-route, I was informed by the Commonwealth Government Health Department that it was illegal to use it for my intended purpose.

The flood gates have now been opened somewhat, as hemp is being grown in Victoria and Tasmania for both industrial and medicinal use. Just how effectively the planting and use of both varieties will be controlled, remains to be seen.


