Happy New Year to our Members and Friends!

Our special guest was Nguyen Minh Thuy, our Operations Manager in Vietnam, who was visiting Australia as part of a national trade mission. Thuy spoke about the efforts to help the needy community of Minh Hac and thanked The Club for its valuable support which has acted as a catalyst to local initiatives. There are currently 40 children in the kindergarten and 30 students in the Primary and Secondary schools receiving support through The Club and its partner sponsors, Overseas Kids Foundation. We also attracted funding from the Rotary Foundation for an additional 60 scholarships.

Interactors Kavya and Felicja presented Thuy with a cheque exceeding \$2,000 for Minh Hac from Balwyn High School fund-raising. 

Professor Katie Allen is a Paediatric Allergist and Gastroenterologist practicing in the field of Food Allergy at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne. She is Director of the Population Health Research Theme at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute and Director of the Australian Centre for Food & Allergy Research (www.foodallergyresearch.org.au). Katie is Principal Investigator of the HealthNuts Study which is tracking 5300 in-

fants to try and understand the cause of the new food allergy epidemic. She has published extensively with more than 255 peer-reviewed papers and book chapters.

Geoff's Health Tip

An Australian Native Honey that is more effective than Manuka



I was recently asked about this new Australian antibacterial honey that is better than the famous Manuka honey from New Zealand. Actually, it is not new but has always been here, however its antibacterial properties were first noticed only after trials that began about ten years ago.

Peter Woodward, a Victorian, established the Australian Organic Honey Company, and began marketing this 'wonder honey' under the trade name Berringa Honey. The honey is obtained from a unique type of tea tree known as Leptospermum Polygalifolium (also known as yellow tea tree) that grows along the coast from northern NSW to Cape York. There are over 600 varieties of tea

tree and areas where the yellow tea tree is more abundant are selected by beekeepers to provide the raw material.

Honeys in general, have antibacterial properties from their ability to produce hydrogen peroxide on the skin, but Berringa honey has un-matched levels of Methylglyoxal, exceeding the amount in Manuka honey and considerably more than regular honey. Methylglyoxal is a compound that forms naturally in honey as a result of chemical reactions through photosynthesis. It has the capacity to kill harmful bacteria and aids in the recovery of everything from strep throat to skin wounds, especially moist wounds, and scars. Honeys that show profound antibacterial properties are in a separate class and are really classified as medicinal honeys, and used accordingly.

This is a great Australian story, similar to discovery of the antiseptic properties of Tea Tree Oil, distilled from the leaves of Melaleuca Alternifolia, that grows in coastal areas from Northern NSW to South East Queensland. Those who find the strong aroma of Tea Tree Oil unpleasant may find another antiseptic oil, from the Lemon Myrtle, more suitable.



A Family Friendly bicycle event encompassing the Great Victorian Rail Trail in Murrindindi Shire and the townships of Yea and Alexandra.


