

On Sunday June 23rd 2017 our Club lost a revered and much treasured retired member with the passing of David Moss Goldsmith PHF.

He resigned from the Club in June 2003, moved to Glen Iris and took up many other interests.

However, his health gradually deteriorated and the last two years became a series of steadily more debilitating medical challenges.

Our older members will recall the arrival in 1984 of David after his membership and past Presidency of the Napier Rotary Club, N.Z. The following year we quickly put his experience to good use by his appointment as Vice President and then deputed him to set up our own Rotaract Club – which he achieved in just four months. Later David led the committee that produced the excellent 'History of the RCNB – the First Twenty One Years.'

In spite of his commitments as the first Principal of the then newly extended Bialik College, David (and Prue) still found time to participate in all Club activities. His being a particular interest in those of a Vocational or Educational nature.

We knew David as a gentleman of integrity, the true embodiment of Rotary's Four Way Test and greatly respected by his many Rotary friends.

Geoff's Health Tip

Olive Oil's key ingredient for preventing Alzheimer's Disease

By now, most households will have a bottle of olive oil in their pantry. It wasn't always so, but it's fair to say that it was the influence of Italian immigrants arriving in Australia after 1945, who used olive oil in their cooking, that made it a popular oil for cooking in Australian households.

We now have <u>many Australian olive growers</u>, especially in the South Australian Riverland and the irrigation area between the Murrumbidgee and Murray Rivers, producing quality table olives and olive oil.



Taste is now an important criteria for olive oil, and there are important technical qualifications such as 'extra virgin, virgin and pure'. However, there is another even more important qualification that is never mentioned on the label. It is the antioxidant content of the oil.

A recent study published in the <u>Annals of Clinical and Translational Neurology</u>, conducted by researchers at Temple University in Philadelphia suggests that it is the olive oil component of the Mediterranean diet, **rich in antioxidants**, that promotes healthy brain ageing. "Our study is the first demonstration that extra virgin olive oil can beneficially affect memory, amyloid plaques, and tau pathology, the hallmark lesions in the brain of Alzheimer's patients."

From the consumer's point of view there is a hurdle that cannot be met until you taste the oil. You may have noticed that some olive oils give you a distinct 'bite' in the back of the throat whilst others are bland, even though they are labelled extra virgin. The olive oil with the distinct bite contains the antioxidants, the bland oil does not.

Freshly produced and bottled olive oil should contain more than 400ppm of antioxidants (mainly polyphenols). The antioxidant content reduces with age and exposure to light, until it is depleted. The full benefit of the antioxidants in olive oil are obtained by using freshly produced olive oil as the primary oil in cooking, salads, dips and vinaigrettes.
