IMPORTANT INFORMATION – CHANGES TO CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS

As advised to Protection Officers and Secretaries at District Assembly by District Director Governance David Whiting below and attached are details on this matter. Please read and share with your Board and Members of the Club.

In April 2012 the Victorian Parliament directed the Family and Community Development Committee enquiring to consider and report to the Parliament on the processes by which religious and other non-government organisations respond to the criminal abuse of children by personnel within their organisations. A report was handed to Parliament in October 2013.

In January 2013 the Federal Government empaneled a Royal Commission to investigate institutional responses to allegations and incidents of child sexual abuse. While a final report is yet to be presented, the Royal Commission has provided regular updates and interim reports.

As a result of its own enquiries, and in the context of the interim reports provided by the Royal Commission, the Victorian government has introduced legislation which applies to the activities of Rotary Clubs. Those changes will require Rotary Clubs to review their practices and processes. They will not automatically require them to change those processes.

At the same time the National Insurance Committee (which organises insurance for Rotary Clubs in Australia) has introduced a new document which requires clubs to go substantially further than ensuring that their members/volunteers involved in youth activities are the holders of Working with Children Checks.



Geoff's Health Tip

Can nutrition intervene to decrease anger and hostility?

The recent appalling unprovoked attack on surgeon Dr Patrick Pritzwald-Stegmann at Box Hill Hospital has raised questions, not only as to the increasing number of attacks by patients in care institutions, but also as to the need to investigate the cause and treatment of sudden aggressive behavior. The 'one-punch' attack on Dr Pritzwald-Stegmann is one of over 90 recorded in Australia between 2000 and 2017 that has resulted in life impairment or death.



While the scientific community was already aware of the benefits of Omega-3 fatty acids in reducing inflammation and promoting neural functioning, more recent studies are confirming that Omega-3 is crucial to the health of cognitive functioning and a positive mood.

A study over 25 years of children in the small island nation of Mauritius has provided some interesting indications. The researchers from the <u>University of Pennsylvania</u> tracked the development of children who had participated in an enrichment program as three year-olds, as well as the development of children who did not participate.

At 11 years, children in the enrichment program showed a marked improvement in brain function as compared with those who did not participate. "We saw children who had poor nutritional status at age three were more antisocial and aggressive at eight, 11 and 17. That made us look back at the intervention, and what stood out about the nutrition component was the children who received an extra three portions of fish a week showed no increase in anger and hostility."

There is now a considerable amount of evidence that shows the negative effects of an Omega-3 shortage in the brain. Without enough Omega-3 fatty acids, people are more prone to anger and hostility. The problem is that our bodies do not produce Omega-3s, we can only get it from food, and of course you all know which foods are rich in Omega-3.
