RCNB has been involved in this community for more than five years and the tangible benefits for the community have been clearly demonstrated through physical projects such as the community centre and education for the children. We look forward to further involvement.

I love some words by Francis of Assisi which fit in brilliantly with this Rotary theme: Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible.

Rotary believes community development encompasses giving people a hand up rather than a hand out and this is what our international projects have done in Vietnam as well as in the Solomon Islands and Bali.

I have done some community development work in India when I was working there for the Girl Guides and it is incredibly rewarding to see results when you help give people a hand up. It can also have its very funny moments. I worked with women's groups and one project we did was to get the ladies to make soft toy elephants to be sold to visitors to India. I have to admit it was a struggle now and then to ensure our toy elephants ended up with four legs and a trunk. Often one leg got left off if the ladies ran out of fabric – so a slightly different looking elephant!!!

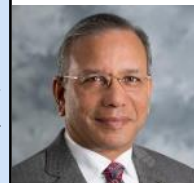

Support for Vietnam

Rowan McClean, John Burley, Chris Burley, Scott Pepin (RC Bacchus Marsh) and Rachael Nguyen (translator and financial advisor), all of whom have been in Vietnam visiting the communities we support in Phu Tho Province, attended the club meeting on 15 October.

John and Rowan discussed progress in Minh Hac, and expressed their delight with the visible evidence of club support, particularly at the Community Centre and in the kindergarten and schools. The community Centre has been paved and is installing a kitchen and toilets. The kindergarten has new roofing and has been provided with two rice cookers and funding to enable 20 very poor children to attend for the first time. In the schools, furniture, books, fans and audio-visual equipment have been installed by means of club support.

John also observed the progress he noticed in just 12 months, where the people themselves have begun new activities. New commercial ventures have sprung up, a farm has been considerably expanded and, based on the success of the Community Centre we helped fund with our Interact club, five other districts in Minh Hac, from limited resources, have commenced their own centres as focus points for community activities.

There were one or two matters not mentioned in the presentation because of time constraints. Trang, the student that Bill Oakley and our Club have jointly funded at University has graduated, and is undertaking an internship in Tourism and Hospitality. We are also exploring an idea for English Language Training linking Balwyn High School with Minh Hac Secondary school.

The assistance being provided by RC Bacchus Marsh to the community of Yen Luat is already showing results, with improved educational access and infrastructure improvements.

The bottom line is that we are extremely pleased with progress in Phu Tho Province, and so are Provincial officials and community leaders.

What a weekend! You may have noticed that we didn't call for local Volunteers for this weekend. There were 25-30 keen Rotarians and Partners from North Balwyn R/C in attendance starting Friday afternoon. Tasks undertaken were -

Grounds

The 3 septic tanks were located and excavated with all the inspection openings and pit lids raised to ground level by boxing and pouring new risers. This means the tanks have seen the light of day for the first time in 40 or so years, and we no longer have to guess where the tanks may be, when they need pumping out. The outfall line from the bottom tank was cleared of the choke. Tree stumps were dug out

New Kitchen

- The sewer, gas, hot and cold water was completed
- The electrical work was completed including 3 phase power point
- The lagging for the hot water pipes was furthered
- The new cupboards were strengthened to take all the crockery and installed
- The kitchen was sanitised and washed out
- All the crockery, cutlery, pots and pans and trays were taken from the old kitchen and sorted out, cleaned, and put in the new kitchen, anything chipped or cracked was discarded. The partners were responsible for this mammoth task
- All the appliances were cleaned and installed
- The big table was installed "what a job"
- The former carport was dismantled and the temporary fence was re-instated
- The columns for stage 2 were grouted under the baseplates
- The external cladding was removed from the old kitchen
- All the electrical circuits wiring was removed from the old kitchen
- Fridges moved to new position after new power point was installed
- Roof iron trimmed back to suit new extension

The Market

Melbourne Market is Victoria's wholesale fruit, vegetable and cut flower trading centre, one of six central fresh produce markets in Australia.

Operating from a new purpose built facility on a 60-hectare site at Epping, the Market provides the critical link between growers, wholesalers, retailers and the fresh produce supply chain.

More than 4,000 businesses use the Market as a base, buying and selling fresh produce in the early hours of the morning for distribution across Victoria and Australia.

Over 1,800 individual fruit and vegetable buyers, representing independent greengrocers, supermarkets, restaurants and food processors, source their produce direct from the Market. Many more receive deliveries and consignments from the Market.

Up to 120,000 square metres of warehousing space provides for the integration of supply chain logistics within the Market itself, and is the largest warehousing precinct of any central market in Australia.

Geoff's Health Tip**Drinking Black Tea is associated with Fewer Fractures in Older Women**

Recently, Dr Richard Prince from the University of Western Australia presented a poster to the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research suggesting that black tea, with or without milk, is associated with a lower risk of bone fracture in older women.

You might remember, two weeks ago I wrote an article on the serious problem of unexpected falls of the elderly, especially if there is a fracture. In this most recent study, Dr Prince and co-workers were examining the records of 1000 women with a mean age of 75, who participated in the Calcium Intake Fracture Outcome Study, when they discovered that

participants who drank at least three cups of tea a day had a 34% lower risk of developing a serious osteoporotic fracture and a 42% lower risk of developing a hip fracture.

Dr Prince said, "previous studies, including their own, had demonstrated a beneficial effect of tea, a major source of dietary flavonoids, on bone structure". "In Western Australia about half of the elderly women already drink three or more cups of tea a day, but young people drink less." "In the USA it would be very difficult to persuade the elderly to shift away from coffee to tea, but in Poland, tea is much preferred to coffee."

Of course, the Calcium study was not designed to prove cause and effect of tea drinking on fracture risk, but future research might show how the long term effect of drinking tea compares with taking therapeutic agents for fracture prevention.
