# IN SERVICE OF ROTARY

#### The (Vice) Presidential Proclamation

In President Jane's absence it was my privilege not only to host the meeting but also to mark Anzac Day and its relevance to our Club's activities. Jane and her team of volunteers are staying and working at the very site of a major World War II battle. Their presence at the town of Henderson in The Solomon Islands, on Guadalcanal and their dedication to the "Days for Girls" Project, is a fine example of a successful exercise in humane contrast. Being at the actual scene of the capture and subsequent defence of the Henderson Airfield in 1942/3 has added a special dimension to

their visit. Over 15,000 Australian, U.S and New Zealanders were killed or wounded in this bloody encounter. We toasted the success of the Rotary Project and wished them well.

On a lighter note we discovered that our speaker, Dr. John Tickell, gets to places that other speakers don't seem to reach or probably don't dare to explore. No longer do we have any excuses for dietary or physical inaction when issued with an invitation to review our life expectancy however dodgy it may be. It questions our "Wellness Rating" and whether we wish to be one of the 350 Australians diagnosed with cancer every day. It's an alarming statistic and a rate expected to double in the next 15 years.

But there is hope. Having travelled the world to research this topic he confirmed that those healthy folk who live on Okinawa Island statistically have the best chance of becoming centenarians. How come? John has studied and simplified the basic health requirements down to four essentials. Plenty of Vegetables, Fish, Laughter and Sex, in no

particular order, which may be why the Okinawans are such a hap-

py lot.

#### Geoff's Health Tip

#### Prunes - just plum good!



After years of being the wallflower of the pantry, prunes are becoming more popular in Australia. In Eastern Europe and Finland, prunes have been a frequent ingredient in the cuisines of those countries for centuries. In France especially, prunes are much sought after as celebrity chefs feature them in their signature dishes. But in Australia, they suffer an image problem because of their wrinkled appearance and their association with the elderly who see their primary use as a laxative.

All this may change as a recent study by researchers at Texas A&M University found that a diet including prunes positively affects the gut bacteria producing butyric acid in the large intestine. From past research, the presence of butyric acid in the large intestine inhibits the incidence of colorectal cancer.

Another study by the University of Liverpool has found that eating prunes as part of a weight-control diet can improve weight loss. This study of 100 overweight and obese low-fibre consumers tested whether eating prunes helped or hindered weight control over a 12-week period. The researchers found that members of the prune eating group lost 2kg in weight and shed 2.5cm from their waist measurement compared with the control group eating healthy snacks who lost only 1.5kg and 1.7cm from their waists.

In these days of rising rates of obesity and colorectal cancer, dried prunes should be on everyone's shopping-list. They are relatively cheap and easy to prepare.

The plum/prune industry is centered around <u>Young in Southern NSW</u> with current annual production of a relatively tiny 3,000 tons. Output is expected to grow to 5,000 tons as more growers join to meet rising demand.
