North Balwyn Rotary supports vocational training program

Great news! Rotary have generously donated funding to provide support for ten Lotus girls to attend a six week Vocational training program in 2018.

Each year the Lotus girls must pass their exams to progress to the next school year. Mrs. Phouvanh the Lotus supervisor meets with the teachers and students each month to review grades. This formative data is a valuable tool to help determine those girls who are 'at risk,' of human trafficking and decide if vocational training may be the best viable option. Discussion between Sengsavang, and Lotus includes students, parents and village council to ensure that the needs of the girls are valued holistically. Lotus acknowledges that in this community not all girls aspire to complete a higher education in the city of Savannakhet, located one hour away. Importantly, not all girls are academically capable of advancing further and thus have a lot of pressure from their families to earn an income, so vocational training is an important viable option for the Lotus girls and much safer than forced labour and prostitution. With funding from Rotary, ten girls would participate in an 8 week vocational training and life skills course at Sengsavang, Savannakhet with the intent that the girls will be educated in a range of viable vocational options and will thus make informed responsible decisions regarding their future education and or career paths.

LOTUS EDUCATION PROJECT- Background

The <u>Lotus Education Fund</u> has been providing support services in remote regions of Laos for 8 years, and was introduced to us by past-member John Burley.

Our Club has supported the Lotus Education Fund to deliver training for village girls in basic vocational skills, life skills and economic /job market skills.



The program is delivered by their partner organisation <u>Sengsavang Shelter</u> which provides support to girls rescued from human trafficking or prostitution.

The training program provides certification on completion that is endorsed by the Laotian Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare, and will be delivered as part of the overall approach to enhance school attendances and reduce poverty in villages.

Completion of this program is followed-up by access to more-specific vocational skills training.

Our Club has committed \$7,500 for this program which is offset by us receiving a District grant of \$2,500.

We have just heard that the Laotian Government has established a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the <u>Laos Ministry of Education and Sport</u> in Champone District and Lotus. Lotus has been awarded official status as a charitable organisation working within the Champhone District and the University of Savannkhet at the provincial level.

TACKLING POVERTY

Rotary supports projects in local communities, but balances that with offshore projects.

Minh Hac in Vietnam is a very poor, remote community of 3200 people. This struggling community was discovered by Rotary Club of North Balwyn past president Rowan McClean in 2010.

Since then, club members and community sponsors have embarked on projects that are transforming Minh Hac.

Children could not previously afford to go to school because they needed to tend animals and pick crops to earn enough money for their daily food. Now more than 100 children have been supported to undertake schooling. Schools have received libraries, furniture, fans and teaching equipment. The health clinic now has refrigeration, computers and toilets.
