

Geoff's Health Tips Microbiome is a word to remember

Microbiome is a new word, and is pronounced micro-bi-ome. In humans, it refers to the collection of bacteria or microbes in our body. It is the bacterial world that lives on and inside our bodies.



Last week I spoke about the toxic bacteria Salmonella, which is so widespread that there is no point in eliminating it; we can only minimise its toxic effects by effective control. Then, there is Staph Aureus, commonly known as 'Golden Staph' with which most of us are familiar, as the yellow pustule or pimple. Interestingly, 20% of the world's population naturally carry it on their skin. These are just two of the toxic bacteria, but there are millions of beneficial bacteria that go about their business inside us, chomping up our food to produce a variety of chemicals such as vitamins, proteins, fatty acids, hormones and whatever our bodies need to survive.

Microbiome science is the study of the bacteria that characterise and optimise your bacterial 'other you' and will likely raise questions about diet and nutrition. Already we know from experience there are friendly bacteria that are found in yoghurt, for instance. These include beneficial bacteria such as S. Thermophilus and L. Bulgaricus in Greek Yoghurt, and Lactobacillus, Lactococcus and Saccharomycetes kefir found in Kefir (Turkish Yoghurt). In addition, several pharmaceutical companies produce tablets and capsules of other strains of bacteria designed for specific health conditions – mostly to assist digestion or increase a diminished supply of gut bacteria.

In future, food companies may begin to develop products designed to assist specific health conditions. At this point in time it is too early to make any predictions, but at least if you hear or see the word Microbiome, you will know that it is about the bacteria collective that live within us.






