#### Guest Speaker on 22 February

Last Thursday the Vocational Committee organised a visit to the Eva Tilley Memorial Home.

In addressing us Sharelle Rowe, the CEO, explained that it is a 120 bed aged care, not-for-profit, community-based facility. It has a voluntary Board of Management drawn from the local community and has included a number of North Balwyn Rotary Club members over the years. In the 1950's Mrs Eva Tilley was the driving force behind the establishment of a residential home for aged people from the community and it was after her untimely death that the facility was named in her honour.

Apart from caring for its residents, community engagement is an important focus of the Community Committee which also has responsibility for fundraising. Sharelle and this committee invited the club as a means of saying thank you for the extensive work carried out over the past two years as part of the gardening project. Given the level of available funding, it would not have been possible for this to be done without the club's considerable input.

Students from Xavier, Camberwell Grammar and MLC worked hard on a number of occasions to clear overgrowth and generally tidy up. Sharelle reported on a recent decision to upgrade a small courtyard that had been cleared by the students to provide a sensual garden for residents. This courtyard is located on the northern side of the facility, facing Nicholson Street. Work is to begin shortly and be completed by early autumn.

At the conclusion of her presentation Sharelle responded to a number of questions indicating a deal of interest in the operation of Eva Tilley.

Members enjoyed drinks and nibbles on arrival and appreciated the excellent BBQ and desserts provided for dinner.

#### From the Board Meeting on 19 February

The Board approved the following items:

- Mongolian Exchange program: we considered this trial short-term exchange to be a success and will continue with this program, but with a year's gap to enable effective preparation for the next outgoing and incoming groups.
- <u>Donations in Kind</u>:- we will provide \$1,500 towards costs of the new racking required in the new building.
- <u>Camp Getaway</u>;- we will set aside up to \$1,500 if required, to support the purchase of a major new fire pump facility for The Camp.
- Shelter Box Repair Kits:- we will provide \$1,000 from our Disaster Relief Fund to enable extra home-repair and survival kits to be available to disaster areas around the world.

## Geoff's Health Tip Lessons in Over-indulgence

Our golf day last Friday was a wonderful success thanks to the volunteers led by CEO Greg Matthews. As a social occasion there is nothing better than to make our Rotary golf day an annual event for people who meet only once or twice a year. In this third year of our Rotary golf day, my 'four' has been the same group of sailors who used to sail competitively every Saturday afternoon at Elwood Sailing Club. All of us have since retired from competitive sailing and have joined in the less strenuous, but more sociable, sport of golf.

Whilst the banter around the course included the usual sailing expressions of jibes, tacks, lifts and knocks being applied to your golfing style or the outcome of wayward drives and putts, it is only part of the day's enjoyment. The rest of the entertainment comes over lunch whilst reminiscing about your, and their, indiscretions sailing 'around the sticks'.

Talking of indiscretions, I must confess that resulting from the overwhelming generosity of my lunch partners, a decision that had to be made (I admit, for the first time) to leave my car at the club-house and get a lift home.

It reminded me of a Health Tip that I wrote last October in which it was recorded that various studies had reported on the toxicity of acetaldehyde, the primary breakdown product of alcohol, and its increasing risks of cancer in the neck, throat and larynx. Whilst overconsumption is not necessarily associated with dependance, one can say that daily consumption of alcohol increases the risk of cancer, which might come as a surprise to most people.

Furthermore, the alcohol industry is not interested in advising consumers with a warning on labels or on any promotional material. Such is the strength of the alcohol industry's lobby group that the dangers of alcohol are supressed and instead the 'responsible drinking' message is promoted.

As part of an experiment in my over-indulgence I can say that alcohol and its by-product acetaldehyde is definitely toxic in the short term, resulting in poor decision making and poor judgement. Nevertheless, a happy and often hilarious time was enjoyed by all.

#### TACKLING POVERTY

Rotary supports projects in local communities, but balances that with offshore projects.

Minh Hac in Vietnam is a very poor, remote community of 3200 people. This struggling community was discovered by Rotary Club of North Balwyn past president Rowan McClean in 2010.

Since then, club members and community sponsors have embarked on projects that are transforming Minh Hac.

Children could not previously afford to go to school because they needed to tend animals and pick crops to earn enough money for their daily food. Now more than 100 children have been supported to undertake schooling. Schools have received libraries, furniture, fans and teaching equipment. The health clinic now has refrigeration, computers and toilets.
