### The Market

*Melbourne Market is Victoria's wholesale fruit, vegetable and cut flower trading centre, one of six central fresh produce markets in Australia.*

*Operating from a new purpose built facility on a 60-hectare site at Epping, the Market provides the critical link between growers, wholesalers, retailers and the fresh produce supply chain.*

*More than 4,000 businesses use the Market as a base, buying and selling fresh produce in the early hours of the morning for distribution across Victoria and Australia.*

*Over 1,800 individual fruit and vegetable buyers, representing independent greengrocers, supermarkets, restaurants and food processors, source their produce direct from the Market. Many more receive deliveries and consignments from the Market.*

*Up to 120,000 square metres of warehousing space provides for the integration of supply chain logistics within the Market itself, and is the largest warehousing precinct of any central market in Australia.*

**Dave's Outback Whirlwind Trip**



**Geoff's Health Tip****Nuts are good but Walnuts are especially good.**

In the days when I lived, as a teenager, in the family home, Sunday lunch was always a roast followed by apple pie. This was followed in the evening by a salad. One of my cherished memories was to see my mother cooking beetroot for the Sunday night salad. Beetroot was something I always enjoyed, even though in those days I did not know it was quite as healthy as it is now believed to be.

Recently, when studying a restaurant menu, I noticed 'Beetroot Salad'. The beetroot salad also contained walnuts and Greek cheese on a bed of rocket tossed with olive oil. The taste I enjoyed the most in the salad was not beetroot, rocket or the Greek cheese, but the walnuts.

Eating nuts as part of a healthy diet is generally recommended by all nutritionists, but walnuts have a special place as they are the only nut containing significant amounts of Omega-3 fats (6-8%), that have been shown to improve heart health.

There are other novel health benefits of walnuts as recently described by Korean scientists from the Ewha Woman's University in Korea. They discovered that walnuts significantly slowed the growth of colon cancer stem cells. Another study at the University of California concluded that it was the Omega-3 fats that are responsible for improved vascular function in postmenopausal women with high cholesterol.



A word of warning! Omega-3 fats oxidise and rancidify quickly. That is why you should buy walnuts in the shell and then crack them open only when required.
