Geoff's Health Tip

General Practitioners should include Muscle strength tests in regular check-ups

I have previously written about muscle strength or the lack of it as you age, and the consequences of frailty. Muscle strength, or muscle mass, gradually falls to the extent of 2% every year after you pass 65 years of age. Unfortunately, loss of muscle mass and strength is under-recognised despite its huge influence and importance for a range of diseases, including type 2 diabetes.

Professor Alan Hayes, a muscle and exercise physiologist at Victoria University, Melbourne, said "In almost any disease, low muscle mass will be implicated. For example, if a patient has an extensive heart operation, but doesn't have the muscle mass and strength to do the physical activity needed to get their heart rate up, then chanc-



es are they won't get better. Muscle health is every bit as important as bone health and obesity".

When you visit your doctor, the first test is to measure blood pressure. I have not found any doctor that looks for loss of muscle strength, principally because there are no recognised tests.

Although there are no standard tests, some simple observations could be made, for exam-

ple the strength of a hand shake, walking speed and the sit-to-stand test. Combining all these observations would provide an indication of muscle weakness and functional decline, which then leads to suggestions on managing loss of muscle strength. Preferably, these tests should be done regularly from 50 years of age so that any weakness is found earlier rather than later.

Most doctors would agree that the first sign of muscle weakness requires a lifestyle change focusing on protein adequacy and exercise.
