

## "To sleep, perchance to dream – what's really happening during general anaesthesia?"

Professor Kate Leslie is a specialist anaesthetist and head of anaesthesia research at the Royal Melbourne Hospital. She is the chair of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA) Clinical Trials Network and a member of the ANZCA Research Committee and ANZCA Foundation Board of Governors.

Kate has done extensive research in awareness and dreaming during anaesthesia and sedation.

She is currently a chief investigator of a large trial looking at the

effects of light and deep general anaesthesia on older patients having major surgery. Kate is a former president of ANZCA, a former chair of the Committee of Presidents of Medical Colleges and a recent recipient of the ANZCA Robert Orton Medal and the Australian Medical Association Woman in Medicine award.

#### **Geoff's Health Tip**

## Prevention is the Key in the War on Cancer

Ever since Richard Nixon officially declared a war on cancer in 1971, billions of dollars has been spent world-wide on research and drug development in an attempt to eradicate the disease. Billions more has been spent by the cancer patients themselves, but with disappointing results.

In Australia, it is estimated there will be 126,800 new cancers diagnosed in 2015, up from 118,711 in 2011, and for people reaching the age of 85 there will be a 1 in 2 chance of diagnosis.

Some may say that the research has not failed, that progress has been made, that the treatment has been a success, but looking at the year on year increase in cases diagnosed, it is obvious that something else is required.

Dr Christopher Wild, director of the International Agency for Research on Cancer, has been a cancer researcher for 30 years. He predicted a 60% increase in cancer burden over the next 20 years, mostly as a result of an ageing population.

As Dr Wild said "researchers are always being asked can they find a cure for cancer" when they like to be asked "can they prevent cancer". Dr Wild said one course of action would be to implement the knowledge gained over the past 60 years about cancer and translate this into preventative actions.

For example, the WHO recently advised that processed meat was carcinogenic and that red meat is also implicated. Through meta analysis of hundreds of research papers we can be sure that the WHO is correct. We already know the effects of smoking tobacco. It is now China's growing deadly addiction with 300 million smokers living in a haze of tobacco fumes (Time Oct 26, 2015).

We must also learn from developing nations such as Somalia where colon cancer in East Africa is extremely rare. It was found that the Somalians consumed cooked rice, sago, lentils some time after cooling to room temperature. Cooling changed the nature of the starches making them beneficial. There are similar examples found in other developing nations. There is much to be learned.
