If members are not yet on a Committee and would like to be, please let Secretary Gavan know as he is finalising our teams.







Geoff's Health Tip How to spoil one of life's greatest pleasures



People over 75 know that, as we age, our bodies begin to stop working as smoothly as they did in our youth. Flexibility and dexterity are lacking, we ache more and our immune system stops functioning as well as it once did. All of this may be linked back to the inflammation of ageing or "inflamm-ageing". This is a newly coined word describing the chronic state of inflammation as we age. Inflammation is always associated with aches, pains and disease.

A previously unknown correlation has recently revealed that there is a link between alcohol consumption and inflammation in the elderly. Researchers at the University of Colorado, Denver, have raised red flags about the effect of alcohol consumption on our immune system and our body's ability to battle infection.

Lead researcher Brenda Curtis, PhD, said "our laboratory has been studying inflammatory and immune responses in the aged for well over a decade. We know that even healthy individuals

have an elevated inflammatory state. Adding alcohol to the fragile immune system of the aged reduces their ability to fight infections". It appears that older people are increasingly turning to alcohol. This is especially so in retirement homes where 'happy hours' can be a nightly occurrence, and three or more drinks every evening are common. A recommendation from the researchers is to consume not more than three drinks on any one occasion and not more than seven drinks in one week.

The goal then becomes to bolster the immune system without aggravating the chronic, inflammatory response. As usual, this can be accomplished with proper nutrition. Whilst short inflammatory periods are necessary in handling temporary events, continual chronic inflammation affects the whole immune system adversely. Foods, such as red meat and processed meat, contain inflammatory markers and should be reduced or avoided. On the other hand, eating a variety of whole-plant foods, whole-grains, vegetables and fruits with the highest anti-oxidant levels, such as berries, reduce inflammation the most.


