Guest Speaker report

Len Raphael began backpacking in 1974 and bitten by the travel bug, then undertook visits to more than 100 countries.

At our club dinner meeting on 31 May, Len took us on a visual journey along the "Silk Road" through the "stans", the former USSR Republics he had visited in 2017.

His theme was "different places, normal people". Len showed photos of families and people in both national dress and clothing that could be found throughout the world in environments quite different from ours. The quality of photographs was first-class, and Len provided sound explanations of the history and architectural scenarios we saw.



The food markets were impressive with a wide variety of quality produce. Meanwhile the buildings and statues built by powerful leaders from expensive imported Italian marble and pure gold, were in stark contrast to areas of housing and the apparent lifestyles of the common people.

It was an interesting journey and highlighted the extreme wealth made possible in many of these areas for the elite through plentiful gas resources.

Geoff's Health Tip

Is there a connection between your gut bacteria and arthritis?

A review of the science of genetics, environment, age and gender has long been recognised as influencing factors in the development of arthritis, but more recently scientists have learned that the bacteria and other microbes that live in the digestive tract are also a factor.

I have previously written about the gut brain connection and whether profiling the gut microbiome (the collection of bacteria and microorganisms) would provide answers to a range of chronic health conditions. It is a science that has been relatively ignored but is now being taken seriously in research organisations worldwide. As an example,

A huge percentage of our immune cells live in the gut where their interactions with certain species of bacteria activate responses in other parts of the body, including inflammatory arthritis, which is characterised by damage to the synovial lining of the joint.

the ABC in its regular segment, 'Life Matters' discussed the influence of diet on gut bacteria.

It is a rather complex field but, as a starting point, research shows that the digestive tracts of people with rheumatoid arthritis have relatively -

- high levels of a bacterium called Prevotella copri, and
- low levels of a bacteria called *Bifidobacterium* (found in yoghurt), and
- more potentially pathogenic (potentially disease causing) bacteria.

In a review of an article headed 'Heal the Gut, Heal the Joints' the author emphasises the need to shift the microbiome towards a permanently improved state of health which requires a permanent lifestyle change. What we eat largely determines the range of microbes – good and bad – that populate our gut.

The overwhelming recommendation indicates 70 percent of what we eat should be plant based, in the form of whole vegetables, which is typically the Mediterranean diet. Perhaps the world's healthiest *diet*, the *Mediterranean Diet* is abundant in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, legumes and olive oil. It features fish and poultry—lean sources of protein—over red meat. Red wine is consumed regularly, but in moderate amounts.
