Thank you to everyone who has so willingly said yes when I have asked them undertake a job or run an activity or help with facebook. I do appreciate this.


I look forward to a great week in Rotary and just remember:

Rotary Gardens Project at 5th July 2015



Geoff's Health Tips Why you should replace sugar with honey

In a previous health tip I exposed sugar, not fat, as the primary cause of obesity. If sugar is the culprit, we should ask what can be used to replace sugar to sweeten our food that is natural and provides a health benefit? The obvious answer is honey. Honey is a whole food with surprising benefits apart from its sweetness.

Honey was the primary concentrated source of sweetness for thousands of years, until 1800 when sugarcanederived sugar became established. We know, from the Bible, that honey was used as a food when John the baptist is said to have lived on a diet of 'Locusts and Honey'. The first written evidence of a reference to honey was found on a 4,000 year old Sumerian tablet. At least another 4,000 years earlier, depictions of humans seeking honey have been found in cave paintings in the Arana caves in Spain.

Whilst the calorific value of honey is slightly more than that of sugar, there is a vast difference in its potential health benefits. Unlike sugar, honey contains a significant vitamin content, as well as the beneficial lactic acid bacteria Lactobacillus and Bifidobacterium (which you will also find in yoghurt).

A study published in the *Journal of Medical Food* in 2004 compared honey to sugar and found that honey was capable of lowering plasma glucose, C-reactive protein and homocysteine in healthy, diabetic subjects. Another clinical study published in the *Journal of the American College of Nutrition* in 2010 found that honey taken with breakfast cereals blunted the glycemic response. A blunted glycemic response may be beneficial for reducing glucose intolerance.

There are many recipes using honey instead of sugar. One I have used successfully replaced sugar with honey in a bread recipe. The Australian honey company, Capilano, has many recipes on its website.
