

Geoff's Health Tips What do you didn't know about Apple Cider Vinegar



Apple Cider Vinegar is a product of the natural fermentation of apple juice. This is a bacterial process in which the sugars in apple juice are first turned into alcohol (apple cider) and then the alcohol ferments further to produce acetic acid (apple cider vinegar) using Acetobacter, the vinegar-producing bacteria.

Most commercial vinegars are distilled. This purifies the acetic acid resulting in a clear liquid with a minimum 4% acetic acid. On the other hand, the health food industry's preference is unpasteurised, unfiltered Apple Cider Vinegar which, in addition to acetic acid, contains mother of vinegar and digestive enzymes arising from the fermentation process.

Traditionally, most medicinal claims date back thousands of years but have little scientific evidence to back them up, probably because the cost of trials can be prohibitive. Needless to say, Apple Cider Vinegar claims have been made to assist weight loss, blood pressure, diabetes, allergies and healthy skin.

In our house, Apple Cider Vinegar is used both as a condiment and a medicinal. As a condiment it is used to make a vinaigrette with olive oil, and I have also used it in bread making together with baking powder.


As a medicinal, we have found it to be much superior to antacid powder for gastric upsets.

You may ask "why would Apple Cider Vinegar, which is acidic, be superior to an antacid powder?" The reason is that most stomach upsets are due the inability of the stomach's acids to cope with the digestion of the food in the stomach and require additional help. The acetic acid and enzymes in unpasteurised, unfiltered Apple Cider Vinegar seem to do the trick.

Some people have noticed the 'mother of vinegar', the jelly-like substance that can form in the vinegar, make the vinegar look cloudy. It is actually a cellulose substance made up of Acetobacters which, in combination with fruit juices, produces vinegar. While not appealing in appearance, it is completely harmless.
