



#### Guest Speaker: Professor Kate Leslie,

#### "To sleep, perchance to dream – what's really happening during general anaesthesia?"

Professor Kate Leslie is a specialist anaesthetist and head of anaesthesia research at the Royal Melbourne Hospital. She is the chair of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA) Clinical Trials Network and a member of the ANZCA Research Committee and ANZCA Foundation Board of Governors.

Kate has done extensive research in awareness and dreaming during anaesthesia and sedation.

She is currently a chief investigator of a large trial looking at the

effects of light and deep general anaesthesia on older patients having major surgery. Kate is a former president of ANZCA, a former chair of the Committee of Presidents of Medical Colleges and a recent recipient of the ANZCA Robert Orton Medal and the Australian Medical Association Woman in Medicine award.

#### Geoff's Health Tip—Berrygood



The nutritionists tell us we should seek out highly coloured fruit and vegetables because they contain high quantities of healthy phytonutrients. In particular, the highly coloured berries such as blueberries and cranberries are the berries of choice, especially blueberries because they are now grown in all Australian states and, in season, are well priced. They have a great taste and as far as I know, are non-allergenic, so everyone can enjoy them.

Blueberries were first introduced to Australia from the USA in the 1950s, but the effort was unsuccessful. Another attempt in the

1970s by the Victorian Department of Agriculture using several American varieties was started and eventually there were three varieties that succeeded.

Production in Australia now exceeds 6,000 tons and one Australian company with plantations in Morocco, to supply the UK market, has been very successful.

Berries are some of the most disease preventive foods on the planet. These little purple and red berries contain anthocyanins, that give the colour. Anthocyanins are believed to be beneficial to your circulatory system by supporting the endothelial lining of your arteries, reducing arterial stiffness. A study reported in the Journal of Nutrition and Dietetics also indicated there was some evidence that daily consumption reduces blood pressure. A Chinese study found the incidence of dementia was higher for those who did not consume berries on a regular basis.

Other studies have reported that the high antioxidant levels in berries is anti-inflammatory, which would mean they have wide-ranging benefits, however I am one person who would say they are not a panacea for all the diseases that are claimed. Nevertheless, berries not only taste good, they are beneficial.
