Meeting Report

On Thursday evening, internationally renowned Criminal and Human Rights Barrister, Julian McMahon, presented on a fascinating career that provided a most sobering view on the injustices within justice systems across the world.

Host, Geoff Kneale, introduced Julian (AC and Victorian, Australian of the Year) and his 'cab-rank style" introduction into the world of capital punishment. Julian

now leads an international team that challenges death sentences anywhere in the world irrespective of the defendant's nationality. Whilst rapidly declined from 15 years ago, today there are 20,000 people on death row – 10 executed every day.

Ronald Ryan was the last Australian execution in 1967. However, 5 Australians have been executed in other countries in the last four decades. Julian shared personal stories about the change in character of Bali 9's Andrew Chan and Myuran Sukumaran from "street punks" to counsellors, young men strong faith.

We were all fascinated to hear insights on how our youth switch from personal, small drug quantity transactions to simply two handfuls of drugs being deemed "executional quantity" whilst the true drug lords are never found nor impacted.

Julian explained his interest in outlawing capital punishment to restore a strong community – "A good community requires both free press and the rule of law. However most capital punishment is driven by politics and corruption that leads to a dysfunctional society".

The evening finished with a robust Q & A session discussing various views on capital punishment and the ability to redeem prisoners such as Chan and Sukumaran.

Nice to see Peter Sutherland back after having his tonsils removed! With Peter are Balwyn High Interactors Julia Goh & Patrick Hatzipavlis.

The Interactors gave an update on their fundraising projects and the causes they are supporting locally and overseas.

The IT session which the Interactors ran last week was attended by 6 Club Members who were appreciative and impressed by what they learnt.

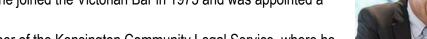

Geoff's Health Tips Goal Setting Slows Cognitive Decline

I was delighted to receive much positive feedback on the 'Stretching Exercises' - the subject of last week's Health Tip. Many readers commented that they have added one or more to their daily exercise routine.

This week, I was interested to read of a novel intervention study that uses goal setting to promote a more active lifestyle that significantly slows cognitive and functional decline.

The study included 220 participants aged at least 65 years divided into a 'goal setting group' and a 'supportive therapy group'. Both groups received five in-home 60-minute treatment sessions over four months, followed by 60-minute maintenance sessions over the next 20 months.

In the study conducted by Professor Robin Casten, Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior at Thomas Jefferson University, Philadelphia, investigators found that 'goal setting and action plans' significantly improved healthy cognitive, physical and social activity compared with a current supportive therapy approach.

* Goal setting and action plans rely on such things as written schedules and step by step sequencing. An action plan might, for example, use a calendar or a smart phone to list the actions or assignments to be undertaken, for instance Thursday - Rotary at 6pm, Sunday 21st October Camberwell Market 6.45am, and record dates of meetings with friends, etc.



The control group using the supportive therapy approach received psychological treatment that facilitates personal expression and conveys empathy, respect and optimism.

After applying numerous tests to assess cognition, the goal setting participants' scores showed there was no cognitive decline, whereas the scores of the supportive therapy participants declined. Furthermore, the goal setting participants had significant annual improvement in executive function.
