Meeting Report The Timor Consortium

To help celebrate Foundation month we were addressed by Vijay Susarla of the Camberwell Club on the Timor consortium.

This started as a small project with a modest budget of \$10,000 putting in a water tank and toilet in a small village in Timor Leste. This village was geographically relatively close to Dili but chronologically and culturally much further away.

It was soon realised that there were many similar vil-

lages which were crying out for similar facilities. It was also realised that this was beyond the abilities of a single Rotary club and so the consortium was established between a number of clubs both within D9800 and beyond with the contact in Timor Leste of the RC Dili.

Much greater funds were required to complete the project so a global grant was sought and received from the Foundation. The grant application was complex and arduous but eventually successful. With the various ways of Matching Grants a multiplier effect came into operation and the budget expanded to \$140,000. Many Rotarians and locals were involved in the construction but with the ideal of sustainability the locals were (with much initial resistance) trained in the maintenance of the facilities and were held to be response.

Some cultural differences were observed where two tanks were damaged due to "fear" of the unknown. Similarly when two other tanks were to be used as replacements and sourced from an unfinished installation there was a reluctance to release them as "possession" is culturally very important in this part of the world.

Vijay stressed the value of global grants to enable a single club to facilitate a large project and also the ability of Rotary and Rotarians to work together to achieve their goal.

Geoff's Health Tips

Daily Yoghurt - more than Flavour of the Month

From small beginnings amongst health conscious European migrants, Australia's daily consumption of yoghurt has grown considerably. At present, 20% of the population regularly eat yoghurt of which flavoured yoghurt currently accounts for 52% of total consumption, and is falling, whilst 'natural' is currently 48%, and rising in popularity.

The word 'yoghurt' comes from the Turkish language, meaning 'curdled' or 'thickened milk', which is pretty much what happens to milk during yoghurt production.

At its simplest, it is milk that is heated and then has live bacteria added. The side of the packaging reveals which bacteria was used, such as Streptococcus thermophilus, Bifidobacterium, Lactobacillus casei and Lactobacillus bulgaricus.

Like milk, yoghurt is a rich source of calcium and protein, and provides other nutrients such as iodine, vitamins D, B2 and B12, and zinc.

Yoghurt has many benefits, including better bone health, reduced risk of developing cardiovascular disease (CVD), and a favourable influence on gut microbiota.

Better Bone Health

In a study of 733 healthy postmenopausal women who ate at least one serving of yoghurt a day had better bone health than women who never consume yoghurt.

Reduce the risk of CVD

New research published in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition suggests that a fatty acid found in dairy could lower the risk of death from cardiovascular disease – and strokes in particular.

Feeding your gut microbiota

Researchers at the University of Virginia School of Medicine have reversed depression symptoms in mice by feeding them Lactobacillus, a probiotic bacteria found in live-cultures yoghurt. Further, they have discovered a specific mechanism for how the bacteria affect mood, providing a direct link between the health of the gut microbiome and mental health.

Club Protection Program

The Club Protection Officer John Rennie addressed the Club AGM on our Protection Policy which covers our work with children and vulnerable adults. This is a critical policy.

It goes to protecting the Club's reputation by seeking to prevent unwanted issues and consequences including adverse publicity and, in a worst case scenario, potential litigation.

Key points made by John included:

- ◆ The Board encourages all members to hold a current Working With Children Card. Under Victorian state law, members must hold a Working With Children Card when working with children. There are no exceptions.
- All projects where children are involved must have an appointed team leader whose responsibility is to ensure all Club members, and others working with them, have a current WWC Card.
- ◆ The Club has produced Child Safe Standards as mandated after the report by the Royal Commission into Child Sexual Abuse. These include taking reasonable steps to protect children from abuse; treating everyone with respect; listening and responding to views and concerns of children; ensuring that where possible lone adults are not left alone with a child; report any allegations of child abuse or harrassment to the President, Vice President or Secretary for further appropriate action; ensure as quickly as possible that the child is safe if an allegation of child abuse is made.

John Rennie is available to provide advice and further detail on these important issues.
