Club Meeting 15 August

Our guest speaker last Thursday was eminent criminal defence lawyer Rob Stary. (pictured right)

He told us how his father, aged twenty seven, and his father's parents migrated here in 1949 to get away from Communist Hungary and before that, the Nazis. His father's interest in social justice rubbed off on Rob, who was brought up in Melbourne's working class western suburbs, attending non-elite schools.

Rob stated that he is unrepentant about his list, over the years, of roque clients and underworld figures, including Julian Assange, Carl Williams, and Tony Mockbel. "I believe very strongly in the rule of law, so we need to robustly defend these people "

Ever since he represented former terror suspect Jack Thomas, he has become the lawyer of choice for terror suspects. He denounced the current terror legislation as a draconian infringement of civil liberties and criticised the Australian Federal Police as acting like a juggernaut out of control" in the way they have implemented the new laws.

It was evident that Rob Stary is a pugnacious crusader for due process and free speech and a committed advocate for upholding the democratic rule of law.

PARTNERS NIGHTS & MEETING ARRANGEMENTS.

President Peter and the Board are keen to have recognised Partner's Nights as a feature of the Club Speaker/ Meeting program this Rotary year and all our meetings in September fit this category.

- *The first is on September 5th when will welcome home the students who recently visited Mongolia with Estelle Kelly and Peter Downton. The title for the night will be The 2019 Mongolian Experience and the students will convey their enthusiasms and insights resulting from their experience of time in an exotic foreign land.
- *On September 12th our guest speaker is ABC journalist Louise Milligan who has written a highly publicised book "The Rise and Fall of Cardinal Pell". This presentation is particularly topical given recent legal proceedings against the Cardinal and Louise will provide a behind-the-scenes look at the issues.
- *The third meeting that may be of interest to Partner's is on September 19th a visit to the Eva Tilley Aged Care Centre in North Balwyn. Eva Tilley has long standing links with RC North Balwyn. We last visited the facility a couple of years ago and there have been many changes since then. Geoff's Health Tip How much Protein do You Need Everyday?

I have previously written about muscle strength or the lack of it as you age, and the consequences of frailty. Muscle strength, or muscle mass, gradually falls after you pass 65 years of age. Unfortunately, loss of muscle mass and strength is under-recognised despite its huge influence on recovery from illness.

Recently ABC Health and Wellbeing ran a program on our daily protein requirements. I found it most interesting and, in particular, the fact that as you age you need more protein, not less.

We think of protein for muscle building, but in fact protein is an essential component present in every part of our body, from hair to toe-nails.

How much do you need? At 60 years of age and 60 kgs weight you need 50 grams a day (0.8 grams per kilo body weight) and at 70 + years of age you need 60 grams a day (1 gram per kilo of body weight) assuming you remain the same weight.

It seems a lot of protein in one day, but if we break it down by selecting foods and protein content you will be able to have an interesting selection from which to choose.

Here is a selection of food and their protein content:

Breakfast and Lunch	Protein	
Two slices of bread 120 grams	14 grams	
Vegemite 2 grams	0.5 grams	
Cereals - Wheat, Oats 4 dessertspoons 50 grams	7 grams	
Slice of tasty cheese 16 grams, eg Bega Slices	4 grams	
Eggs - one 60 grams	7 grams	
Nuts - Almonds, Cashews, Walnuts 10 grams	2 grams	34
grams		



Evening Meal

Red Lentils - third of a cup 60 grams5 gramsBeans - fresh60 grams15 gramsPotato - 100 grams2 gramsRed Meat 100 grams22 grams ORChicken 100 grams22 grams OR

Fish 100 grams 18 grams 40 to 44 grams

Total 74 to 78 grams

Vegetarians will need to increase their plant food consumption, especially beans. Incidentally, the popular baked beans served on toast will provide all the types of protein your body requires.
