Geoff's Health Tip

Recently there has been a great deal of media coverage on the alledged carcinogen glyphosate, the active herbicide in Roundup. Roundup has been linked to cancers, diabetes, Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, liver disease, kidney disease, birth defects and more. On top of that, many believe it's what's been [killing off the world's bees](#), vital participants in the human food chain.

A survey of commercial American beers found levels as high as 49 parts per billion (ppb) with an average of 20 ppb. On the other hand, several organic beers had an average of 3.5ppb, and in one organic beer the carcinogen was undetectable. I would think we would find similar results in Australia.

Does US wine contain glyphosate? Yes it does, and in the same amount as commercial beer, but again the organic wines were of the same order as organic beer. Don't ask me whether there is any in whisky!

Everyday we read and hear about people who have these diseases and yet while it is most distressing to the person and family concerned, the rest of the population do not seem to care.

In my view we should all consider moving to certified organic products in place of the commercial varieties. I say this because Roundup is not the only car-

cinogen in food. There are others which have since been removed from the food chain as the regulators gather information on their effect on public health over many years.

According to new research, published in the *Australian Organic Market Report 2018*, as many as eight million Australian households buy organic grocery products every year, but the higher price tag that goes with going organic is keeping many more from getting involved. This may change as people get more concerned about their health and farmers respond to the increased demand for organic foods.

As Professor Marc Cohen from RMIT University said *"I suspect eating less poison is good for you"*.
