Meeting Report "Police Dog Squad" Speaker Sergeant Mark Boysen

This week's speaker was head of the Victoria Police Dog Squad, Sergeant Mark Boysen. The squad was formed in 1975.

IMark joined Victorian Police in 1985 spending his first 6 years at stations across Melbourne including Carlton, City West, St Kilda Annex and Moonee Ponds. It was in 1991 that Mark joined the Dog Squad where he is the Officer in Charge Training and General Purpose Dog Handler.

Male German Shepherds make the most suitable Police Dogs. Their extensive training is focussed upon a number of disciplines including tracking, searching, obedience, property location and subduing/arresting offenders.

Siege Dogs is a further area of development for the particularly well-developed Police Dog.

The searching role of a Police Dog is vast and includes not only searching for offenders but also Missing Persons, narcotics (Ice, GHB, MDMA), firearms, ammunition and cash (but not Bitcoin, Mr Romanis!)

Obviously a 24 hour state wide response unit, Mark leads an incredibly critical role to keep Victorians safe. In fact, last year the Dog Squad attended over 7,400 operations across the state that included helicopter urgent fly-ins, street scanning operations, dance parties, music festivals and search warrants.

Mark described a number of real-life assignments whereby his most loyal and trustworthy partner is the same partner he gets to take home at night. The pair have also competed in a number of international Police Dog competitions.

German Shepherds are beneficial to policing not only in Victoria but across the world, due to their

nose ability, size to quickly cover great distances and their non-threatening calm demeanour. While Mark explained Vic Pol only use German Shepherds and Labradors, for some other roles, some Police Departments across the world use Bloodhounds. Unfortunately Bloodhounds can be a little too judgemental during a critical incident.

Fundraising for Mongolia - The Why and Wherefore

The Memorandum of Understanding we have with National Camping Association of Mongolia includes that the internal costs (travel, meals and accommodation) of the trip by our group visiting Mongolia will be paid by Mongolia; and, in return, we will pay the equivalent costs for the Mongolian Contingent visiting Australia, so our Club has two separate and distinct sets of costs in relation to the Mongolian Exchange program.

Last time these costs for the visiting Mongolian group totalled approximately \$9000. Last time also, the Board felt that it was appropriate that the young people going to Mongolia should work to raise some part of this amount to help defray Club costs and to recognise that, indirectly they benefit from this expenditure. The outgoing Mongolian trippers and their families also contribute to this reciprocal arrangement by providing most of the home hospitality for the incoming group.

The outgoing Mongolian trippers and their families have enthusiastically embraced the idea of raising these funds. The proposal we put was that 50% of the funds they raised would go to our Club to defray the hosting costs, and 50% would go to the individuals raising the funds to cover some of their out of pocket expenses. Many of you will have seen the girls and their family members at various of our fundraising activities during this year where they have made a big impact and have supported the Club's efforts. In addition they have organised and run a number of fundraising activities of their own.

The team leave for Mongolia on June 28th and by that time will have raised over \$7000, of which around \$4300 will contribute towards the Club's costs in hosting the incoming Mongolian group next January. Not only has this activity helped the Club financially, we have added to our Rotary family with several parents expressing the wish to stay on as Friends, and one who has already joined our Club as a member.

Geoff's Health Tip

Lowering Blood Pressure May Have Positive Effects on Alzheimer's

Several observational studies have shown high blood pressure in middle age to be a risk factor for Alzheimer's disease in later life.

Last year, I reported on a study presented at the Alzheimer's Association International Conference in Chicago in 2018. The study involved 9,300 elderly people with hypertension, who were taking anti-hypertensive medication.



* The results of the 4-year study that required strict blood pressure control for 3.2 years, with a systolic target of 120 mmHg or lower, showed that the incidence of mild cognitive impairment was reduced by a significant magnitude compared with people registering a systolic blood pressure of 140mmHg.

A recent peer reviewed study showed that reducing blood pressure increases blood flow to the hippocampus, an area of the brain associated with Alzheimer's disease.

In this study, conducted by Jurgen Claassen MD, PhD, Universal Medical Centre, Nijmegen, Netherlands, researchers wanted to look at the effect of lowering blood pressure on cerebral blood flow in Alzheimer's patients, with a particular interest in the hippocampus.

- * The researchers found cerebral blood flow remained stable when blood pressure was lowered.
- * This is an important finding as some physicians seem to want blood pressure in the elderly to be higher to maintain cerebral blood flow on the assumption that reducing blood pressure exacerbates memory loss the results suggest that the opposite may be the case.

On the mechanism, Claassen speculated that high blood pressure might trigger reduced blood flow to the brain and hippocampus, with the blood vessels becoming thicker to withstand the higher pressures. Claassen commented that "what we think of as 'normal' blood pressure is probably still too high when it comes to negative effects on the cardio-vascular system and the brain. Even mildly elevated pressure could lead to cerebral blood vessels adapting".

Current results have several potential implications:

- * First of all, for patients with Alzheimer's, there is no reason not to treat with antihypertensives, as lowering blood pressure does not compromise cerebral blood flow.
- * All these findings add to the body of evidence that controlling blood pressure to 120/70mmHg in middle age is not only good for the heart but good for the brain.


