This week we heard from our Speaker Tim Lynch, Associate Professor in the School of Social and Political Sciences at the University of Melbourne, whose academic focus has been on American power. He has studied American leadership in detail from George Bush Senior to Donald Trump.

Much of the focus of his well-received presentation was on the style and approach of current President Trump, which he used a five dimension model to analyse. He observed that Trump is a populist and not an academic thinker. He does not read. His use of Twitter has been unique as a form of communication. He is first and foremost a nationalist and, unlike many of his predecessors, this over-rides globalism. Trump also emphasises "make" rather than "consume".

Dr. Lynch contended that Trump is consistent, even through the chaos he creates. The final point in the model was that Trump uses instinct rather than expertise, something we have all observed.

There is no doubt that Trump is different, unpredictable and shuns the diplomatic approaches of most previous Presidents of the United States. Lynch observed that Melania deserves praise for seemingly keeping him more constrained than he might otherwise be!

Trump has churned through advisors, made some incredible announcements and shocked us all at times.

It will be interesting to see if he is successful in winning a second term.

A note from Bill Oakley

The RAM National Conference (which is being held in Melbourne this year at Ciloms Hotel which is near the Airport) is quite one of the best Rotary gatherings I attend each year. Its content is all relevant to RAM's and Rotary's fight against malaria.

Australian Rotary has taken responsibility for helping a group of our near neighbours in their fight against malaria - PNG, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Timor Leste, and, growing out of our work with Timor Leste, we are also starting work in NTT Province in Indonesia, which surrounds Timor Leste.

At the conference will be representatives from these countries and from the RAM organisations doing the work on the ground in these countries. There will also be speakers from the main research organisations in Australia which is the World's leading centre for malaria research.

There will also be a speaker from the Australia Defence Force School of Tropical Disease Research. Australian military people are active in many places around the World where malaria remains endemic, and lead the World in developing processes, practices, pills and procedures to keep soldiers "fight-ready" in tropical disease areas.

Geoff's Health Tip

The Heart Foundation and The Mediterranean Diet

New guidelines from the Heart Foundation show that we should move closer to the Mediterranean Diet to reduce the risk of disease, and maintain wellness.

The Mediterranean Diet is typical of the diet of southern Greece. The key components include:

- * Olive oil as the main source of fat
- * High intakes of fish, vegetables, fruit, nuts, and legumes
- * Low meat and dairy consumption
- * Avoidance of sugary and processed foods, particularly processed meat, and moderate alcohol consumption.

I first read about the Mediterranean Diet in a 1994 study called the Lyon (France) Heart Health Study.

- * This was a study involving patients that had suffered a heart attack. They were divided into two groups. One group was requested to follow a typical Mediterranean Diet and the other was to continue with their normal diet.
- After a five year and a final 10 year follow up it was found that those following the Mediterranean Diet had suffered considerably fewer secondary cardiovascular events than those on the normal diet, whilst mortality was also significantly less. This study has been repeated several times with similar results.

Since the 1994 Lyon Heart Health Study, other researchers have shown the Mediterranean Diet is also protective against depression and stroke, and there is now evidence to show sleep quality is improved.

- * In searching the literature that investigated the influence of diet on depression, researchers from the Department of Public Health, University College London, included 41 studies in their review.
- * The results showed that there is compelling evidence that diet could be part of a comprehensive approach to treating and preventing depression.
- * Another study conducted at the University of East Anglia confirmed previous findings suggesting that the Mediterranean Diet reduced the risk of stroke. The evidence showed the results were more pronounced in women than men.
- In another large study of 1600 adults conducted by the Department of Nutrition at the Harokopio University, Athens, investigators showed that sleep quality, rather than sleep duration, is positively associated with adherence to the Mediterranean Diet.

Will these compelling results help you modify your diet?

NIGERIA has announced that three years had elapsed since it last recorded a case of polio, a key step towards eradicating the notorious disease in Africa.

"Three years without a case of wild polio virus is a historic milestone for Nigeria and the global community," said Faisal Shuaib, director of the National Primary Health Care Development Agency. Nigeria, Africa's most

Nigeria, Africa's most populous nation, was the last country on the continent to suffer from outbreaks of the wild polio virus, but has recorded none since August 2016.


Dear Troops,
