Our Guest Speaker, Jane Sullivan, (pictured right) kept us enthralled with her stories of literature and how this has influenced her life.

Many members knew of Jane through her column in The Saturday Age, which she believes is the longest running column in the paper. In her words - she has always been besotted with books.

Jane's love of books was instilled in her from a very early

age. She told a very evocative story of sitting on the floor in her father's study while he worked – he was an artist who created cartoons and she would also draw stick figures with words in balloons. Gradually the figures grew smaller and the words increased. Her literary career followed.

She is a writer of fiction, having written two novels and a brand new publication entitled "Storytime". She is now a freelance writer specialising in literary journalism.

Her career has also included reporting from Africa and China and she won the inaugural Australian Human Rights award for journalism.

Jane focused on how she went back to reread books from her childhood and to analyse if the memories she had of those books from past still held true in the present. She named her favourite book as "Wind in the Willows" and her least favour-

ite author as Enid Blyton. Other books mentioned included The Magic Pudding, the Harry Potter series, the Narnia series, Alice in Wonderland and many others that members could recall as having read in the past.

Members were also interested in her thoughts on book groups and why it appears that they are more popular with women than with men.

The printed word might be changing its format with the digital age but books will continue.

Jane also had some copies of her latest book "Storytime" for sale, which members snapped up at a bargain price.

Geoff's Health Tip

An Alternative Strategy for Obesity Prevention

Many scientists are guilty of clinging to pet theories despite overwhelming evidence that they are mistaken. They have a fascinating ability to rationalise away evidence that doesn't support their views. Of course this can also apply to engineers, accountants and virtually everyone, not just scientists.


Readers of 'Health Tips' might remember an article titled 'It's Not Fat It's Sugar' in which the previous notion that consuming fat, especially saturated fat, was the root cause of obesity was shown to be false and that the real culprit was sugar.

This hypothesis is now being disputed by Dr Kevin Hall from the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIH) USA, who claims the culprit is ultra-processed food.

Dr Hall's studies suggest that a dramatic shift in how we make the food we eat bears the brunt of the blame in the rise of obesity. In describing how we make the food we eat, Dr Hall describes ultra- processed food as food made by 'pulling ingredients apart and then recombining them to make ready-to-eat meals'. Ultra-processed food is also distinguished by the large number of ingredients detailed on the package.

To illustrate Dr Hall's theory, researchers enrolled 20 weight-stable adults. The subjects were randomized to receive either ultra-processed or unprocessed diets for 2 weeks immediately followed by the alternate diet for 2 weeks. The subjects were instructed to consume as much or as little as they desired.

Despite the ultra-processed and unprocessed diets being matched for calories, sugar, fat, fiber, and macronutrients, people consumed more calories when exposed to the ultra-processed diet compared to the unprocessed diet. Furthermore, people gained weight on the ultra-processed diet and lost weight on the unprocessed diet.



Take home message. Limiting consumption of ultra-processed food may be an effective strategy for obesity prevention and treatment.

Dr Andrew Browning

Maternal health care in Africa- an Australian intervention

Dr Andrew Browning spent 17 years living with his family in Ethiopia and Tanzania amongst some of the poorest people in the world.

He specialises in treating a devastating birth injury called obstetric fistula. This results from women giving birth at home, without medical help. In labour for four or five days they deliver a stillborn child and the tissues in their pelvis are destroyed, leaving them with large holes (fistula) to their bladder and bowel. Leaking continually they are shunned, depressed and suicidal.

Andrew is one of only a handful of surgeons in the world who have dedicated their lives to helping treat and prevent this. His charity has now built three maternity hospitals in Africa and aims to build many more.

All funds raised will be used to support Rotary Foundation projects that make lives better in your community and around the world




