
Brian Thomas was kept busy on the trip servicing the sewing machines, not only the Toyota machines, but also other makes that ladies brought along to the training sessions.

Natalie hopes to put together 200 to 400 "hampers" (or gift bags) this Christmas.

As a representative of North Balwyn Uniting Church, Days for Girls and North Balwyn Rotary, Diane Goetze has been approached by Natalie to seek donations of toiletries to provide Christmas Hampers for both men & women such as:-

- Shaving Cream, Razors, deodorants for men.
- Make-up etc for women.
- Small hair shampoo and conditioners, talc, toothpaste and tooth brushes for all, plus mugs, and Sunscreen, as many psych medications increase the susceptibility to sunburn.

If anyone has sample units of these commodities, eg, contents of airline travel bags, will be most welcome.

Could you approach your local pharmacies and/or supermarkets for donations.

Food such as:-

- Small tinned meats in ring-pull cans tuna, salmon, chicken.
- Snacks such as soft muesli bars, and
- Christmas treats such as shortbreads, mince pies are also sought.

Donations can be left at North Balwyn Rotary meetings or at the GOETZE home no later than the morning of Friday 14<sup>th</sup> December to allow time for packing before the Christmas Day Luncheon.

#### Geoff's Health Tips

#### Which Sunscreen Should you Buy?

In this present cooler weather it's hardly appropriate to write about sunscreens, but shortly there will surely come sunny days and an avalanche of advice on sunscreens, and how to protect one-self from getting skin cancer or a more serious melanoma.

Some of us, including myself, who can trace their geneaology back to the Celts of central Europe, are 99% certain to develop skin cancers, especially on the ears and the backs of wrists. It has often been said, "We are in the wrong country when it comes to enjoying the benefits of the sun".

In 1998 the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) set up a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) standard that uses solar lamps to simulate the sun's rays and therein lies a basic testing flaw – are solar lamps an effective substitute for the sun's rays in an open-air environment?

\* An SPF of 30 means the number of additional minutes the sunscreen protects your skin. I tested the skin on my back and found it went pink after fifteen minutes. Applying a cream with an SPF of 30 means I would be protected for 450 minutes (15 x 30) = 7 hours. I know one person using an SPF 30 product who suffered sunburn on crossing from Queenscliff to Sorrento on the ferry – less than 60 minutes.

In the past 20 years the chemical compounds developed for sunscreens have been quite successful in <u>absorbing</u> the sun's rays. Actually, the energy from absorption is turned into heat, however most people don't notice the slight rise in temperature on the skin's surface, as it is quickly dissipated.

The other type of sunscreen is the <u>reflective</u> type made using zinc oxide or titanium dioxide. Although these have a ghosting effect on the skin they are very effective and, in my view, safer overall.

\* The <u>best advice</u>, whichever sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or more you choose, is to apply it at least 20 minutes before you go into the sun and ensure the cream is applied evenly and absorbed by the outer layer of skin.
