Bryan Martin OAM has been involved in the Sport of Racing for over 50 years.

Bryan Martin's professional and tireless services to the Sport of Racing has been recognized by many.

- * Order of Australia 2011 for services to radio and charities.
- * Australian Sports Medal for his service to the Horse Racing Industry.
- * The Kingston Town Award (twice) for his service to the Cox Plate.
- * The Bart Wolfe Award (twice) for Media Excellence.
- * Bryan Martin also chaired the Racing Hall of Fame for ten years.

Bryan lifted what was already a jovial meeting to one with a real buzz by force of his likeable personality, rich speaking voice, and memorable recollections from a lifetime in racing, both here and overseas. He took us from the pomp and spectacle of the Queen's arrival by coach at Royal Ascot to the tiny inland north Queensland town of Georgetown where he met and loved fair dinkum rural Aussies that we city folk hardly know of.

His talk was complemented by exciting visuals of his calling of the 2003 and 2006 Cox Plates (both won by his own horse, Fields of Omagh) and the 1990 Japan Cup, won by Australian horse, Better Loosen Up. Bryan concluded with a slightly tongue-in-cheek phantom call of the last 800 metres of this year's Melbourne Cup.

Bryan so successfully generated our interest for this year's first Tuesday in November that host Bob Bott commenced his words of thanks with "Bryan, I am speechless!"

Geoff's Health Tip

Salads Should Always Include Beetroot - Here's Why

It's summer and salads are the preferred meal at least 2-3 times a week for many families.

They are easy to prepare and furthermore must be at the top of the list of unprocessed ingredients. One ingredient that has been a favourite vegetable of mine ever since I was a child is beetroot.

Maybe it was its bright purple-red colour that was like no other vegetable. The plant pigment that gives beetroot its rich, purple-crimson colour is betacyanin. I can remember my mother preparing the beetroot and the red stain it left on her fingers which she removed by rubbing lemon juice on her hands.

- * Beetroot is especially interesting because of the high nitrate levels contained in beetroot juice, which could prove to be a low-cost and effective way to treat cardiovascular conditions and blood pressure.
- * A 2008 study published in *Hypertension* examined the effects of ingesting 500 millilitres of beetroot juice in healthy volunteers and found that blood pressure was significantly lowered after ingestion.
- * A Queensland study provided new insights into the acute effects of nitrate-rich beetroot juice on blood pressure, platelet reactivity and whole blood coagulation in a population of older adults. "Our data confirm our findings supporting the blood pressure-lowering effects of dietary nitrate in healthy older adults."
- * Beetroot juice supplementation has been shown to improve muscle oxygenation during exercise. Paralympic gold medalist David Weir claimed that a shot of the juice was his secret to success.
- * Quality of life has improved for those with cardiovascular, respiratory or metabolic diseases, who find the activities of daily living physically difficult because of lack of oxygenation.
- * The Queensland study concluded "together, our findings provide tentative support of the notion that the regular consumption of beetroot could be a key component of lifestyle interventions to preserve cardiovascular health with advancing age".

Dr Andrew Browning

Maternal health care in Africa- an Australian intervention

Dr Andrew Browning spent 17 years living with his family in Ethiopia and Tanzania amongst some of the poorest people in the world.

He specialises in treating a devastating birth injury called obstetric fistula. This results from women giving birth at home, without medical help. In labour for four or five days they deliver a stillborn child and the tissues in their pelvis are destroyed, leaving them with large holes (fistula) to their bladder and bowel. Leaking continually they are shunned, depressed and suicidal.

Andrew is one of only a handful of surgeons in the world who have dedicated their lives to helping treat and prevent this. His charity has now built three maternity hospitals in Africa and aims to build many more.
