



## Meeting report 5 December

Greg Sheridan AO, well-known political commentator, author, and foreign affairs journalist at "The Australian" gave us an enthralling talk.

In his latest book, "God is Good for You" Greg moves away from politics (somewhat) to defend Christianity in a secular age. He argues, persuasively, that our society will be permanently impoverished if we become ignorant of the great debt which our democracy and rule of law owes to Christianity, the first religion to treat all people, even slaves, as equal in the eyes of God and therefore, through social evolution, as equal in the eyes of our law.

Why was Greg's talk enthralling? Firstly, the absorbing content. Secondly, his manner of delivery was one of such charisma and presence that, at no time, did his audience want him to finish.

But, best of all, was his frequent use of humour. He even managed to find humour in the Old Testament where he likened God sending out Jonah on a difficult mission to an overbearing News Corporation editor sending out his hapless and resentful journalist on a difficult assignment.

If we heard similar in church on Sundays, pews would be filled and slumber-inducing sermons would be no more.

The recognition also provides assurance to Rotary Districts that the project is run in accordance with Rotary Policy and Procedures, and is auditable and properly managed.

### Geoff's Health Tip

#### Move over Apples, Avocados do a Better Job

Right now Avocados are plentiful and well priced, and of course we have all enjoyed smashed avocados on toast at any time of the day.

New research shows avocados significantly boost lutein concentrations in your brain, with corresponding improvements in cognitive function. Lutein has beneficial antioxidant and anti-inflammatory effects, and avocados are an excellent source.



Lutein is a carotenoid that's excellent for your brain. Lutein accumulates in the macular region of your eye's retina.

Macular pigment is largely comprised of lutein and another carotenoid, zeaxanthin, and plays an important role in filtering blue light, while also offering antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties.

Considering that one avocado contains about 0.5 milligrams (mg) of lutein, researchers were interested to know if eating this healthy fruit could benefit cognition.

For six months, 48 adults consumed either one avocado, one potato or one cup of chickpeas daily -- the latter two options serving as control options, since they contain no lutein.

At the end of the study, lutein levels in the avocado group increased by 25%, compared to 15% in the control group (which may have been due to unreported dietary changes that took place during the study). However, the avocado group also had an increase in macular pigmentation after six months, while the control group did not.

Along with improvements in memory, those eating an avocado a day had improved sustained attention, working memory and efficiency in approaching a problem, leading researchers to conclude, "Dietary recommendations including avocados may be an effective strategy for cognitive health".

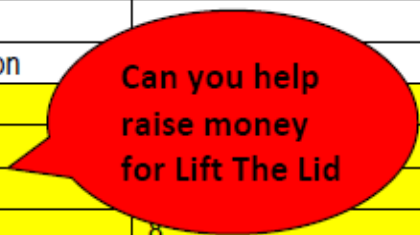
