Meeting Report

Our Speaker, Sue Taffe, who is a Melbourne based historian, provided us with an incisive look into the life of Mary Montgomerie Bennett, a "under recognised figure in Australian history". Mary Bennett was one of the first advocating for Aboriginal Rights.

Whilst born in England, Mary Bennett's childhood on a Queensland pastoral run operated by her father (who had a deep sympathy for the dispossessed Dalleburra people on his pastoral run) led Mary to become active in improving conditions for Aboriginal people.

Mary gave evidence before a UK Commission in 1924 into "the Conditions and Treatment of Aborigines", admonishing the Western Australian government for it's policy of separating children from their parents. 'No department in the world', she told the Commission, 'can take the place of a child's mother and the Honourable Minister does not offer any valid justification for the official smashing of native family and community life'.

When her English husband died in 1927 she returned to Australia, working as a teacher at Mount Margaret Mission near Laverton in Western Australia, where she taught children the skills they would need to enter the white man's world.

From her Kalgoorlie home, she assisted the aged and unemployed to apply for pensions. Mary's ideas about the position of Aboriginal people in Australian society were inclusive and rights-based, and demonstrated her recognition of universal human needs - to raise a family and to find work to support it.

She drew on United Nations' conventions such as the International Labour Organisation's 1957 Convention 107 on 'Indigenous and Tribal Populations' pressuring the Federal Council for Aboriginal Advancement to use this Convention as a basis in planning its 1959 conference. She combined a deep humanity and interest in individuals with a clear-minded recognition of the way such international conventions might be used to shame governments. Sue's book on Mary Bennett *is A White Hot Flame*

Geoff's Health Tips

What do you do if you get bitten by a snake?

Before I read an authority on the treatment of snakebites I believed you should apply a tourniquet between the bite and the heart and also make incisions at the site and suck out the poison. I could not have been more wrong!

Snakes are found in every state and territory of Australia, with most snake attacks occuring near houses in suburbs near waterways, such as Ivanhoe and Kew.

There are five genus of venomous snakes that will harm us: Browns (pictured), Blacks, Adders, Tigers and Taipans. If you are bitten don't try to identify the type of snake as hospitals now carry an antivenin that neutralises all venoms.

Whilst walking in long grass or bushy terrain you may be bitten without feeling the bite or seeing the snake, but <u>common symptoms</u> of a snake bite include an unexplained collapse, vomiting <u>and abdominal pain, bleeding or paralysis</u> which is why it is extremely important to act quickly.



About 3,000 people are bitten by snakes in Australia each year, with about 500 hospitalisations and 2-3 deaths.

According to Rob Timmings, Director ECT4 Health, Toowoomba, Queensland:

- * When a snake bites, venom is injected into the flesh of your limb and into the lymphatic system, not your blood.
- Venom travels through your lymphatic system (which makes up the bulk of water in your tissues). You need to stay calm and not move whilst help is being summoned moving limbs allow the venom to move through the body.
- If there is a first aid kit available, wrap a bandage about 10cm wide over the site of the bite, if it is on a limb, and without removing clothes wrap the limb to the armpit or groin to act as a splint. This technique is called 'Pressure Immobilisation'.
- * Do not allow the victim to walk or move their limbs. Put the patient on a stretcher for transportation to hospital.




