RCNB Vocational Business Awards 2019

After Vocational Service Director Kinga Paulheim highlighted the importance of Vocational Service as an Avenue of Rotary Service and its relevance to each member representing their vocation, the two recipients of our Vocational Business Awards 2019 were introduced. The first, a local business for nearly three decades, was Signorelli's North Balwyn. The second, in its tenth year, was The Village Café.

In his response, Colin Signorelli reflected on a business that started in 1991 with his parents, himself and younger brother Dean. His father, now 75, still works at the shop and the staff has grown to 25, some employed for 20 years, others on a part-time basis, including their children on Saturdays. From simply fruit and veg at the start, the business changed direction and now includes gourmet products.



Their clientele include adults who first shopped at Signorelli's as children. Colin and Dean's wives, Julie and Sandra, also both work in the very successful family enterprise. Colin finished by saying that while competition is a healthy thing, the number of fruiterers in Australia has diminished from 3,000 to less than 600. This is due to the very early hours involved which hold little appeal to younger people.

Samir from The Village Café then spoke animatedly about the importance of hard work in making a service industry successful. He and Lina have had nearly 34 years in the food experience business. They started in 1986 in Wonthaggi and married two years later. Then to Morwell for 11 years where they opened multiple businesses, including a successful Chinese restaurant. After time in Chirnside Park and Knox (running five cafes), Sam and Lina saw a site in North Balwyn with great potential, observing that the owners obviously didn't care about their customers, and they bought it. The success of The Village Café over the past nine years Sam attributed to the excellence of their staff, the skills of his wife and the goodwill of their customers. *(He didn't mention the ability and charisma he has in his dealings with their many customers.)*

The questions that followed were answered brilliantly and honestly and provided further insight into why Signorelli's and The Village Café continue to be so successful in the North Balwyn neighbourhood.

At the AGM this week I will propose a motion accepting the Financial Statements for FY19.

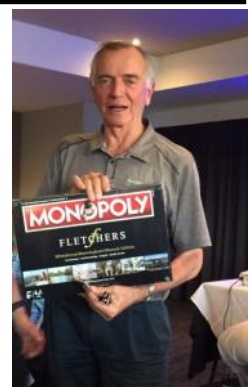

Geoff's Health Tip**Be Brainwashed while Asleep**

In 2012, a team of scientists from the University of Rochester USA, discovered a system the brain uses to remove accumulated waste in brain tissue.

It was revealed that the brain sporadically pumps cerebral spinal fluid through brain tissue, essentially flushing damaging waste out into the body's circulatory system. It was demonstrated that the brain washes away toxic proteins only during a specific phase of deep sleep.



Recent research also found significant associations between disrupted sleep patterns and the development of dementia and Alzheimer's disease.

The most recent study of this kind found a specific correlation between low levels of slow-wave sleep and greater accumulations in the brain of toxic proteins generally associated with Alzheimer's.

Because sleep often becomes increasingly lighter and more disrupted as we become older, the study reinforces and potentially explains the links between aging, sleep deprivation, and heightened risk for Alzheimer's disease.

In the search for a clearer causal understanding of this association between sleep disruption and dementia, a new study set out to identify if there is a certain phase of sleep specifically connected to the glymphatic system activity clearing the brain.

To examine this, researchers used six different anesthetic regimens on mice to stimulate a variety of sedated neural states.

Out of the six drug-induced states, one state in particular generated neural activity and heart rates most similar to that of a human in deep, slow-wave sleep. This particular sleep state also generated the best glymphatic system activity and, even more importantly, suggests a neural mechanism that could explain why this particular sleep phase can stimulate the brain cleaning process.

Maiken Nedergaard, M.D., D.M.Sc., at the University of Rochester Medical Center said "Sleep is critical to the function of the brain's waste removal system and this study shows that the deeper the sleep the better". "These findings also add to the increasingly clear evidence that quality of sleep or sleep deprivation can predict the onset of Alzheimer's and dementia".
