Geoff's Health Tip More than Just Sweet and Wet

The Queensland town of Kingaroy offered its congratulations to the nearby town of Chinchilla – known as the 'melon capital of Australia' – after it became the proud owner of the four-ton, nine metre-long watermelon on Wednesday.

But do Australians really enjoy melons? I have noticed that sliced watermelons and other melons are universally served at breakfast in hotels and at breakfast functions. I have also noticed that older people do not relish seeking out melons as part of their normal



year round shopping routine, maybe they are too heavy to cart to the car? On the other hand younger families buy them as a treat for their children, but watermelon is so much more than a treat.

- * Watermelon is exceptionally rich in lycopene (hence its red colour) and other carotenoids that boost your antioxidant levels. Watermelon's high levels of lycopene are very effective at protecting cells from damage and may help lower the risk of heart disease according to a study at Purdue University.
- * A study published in a 2012 *American Journal of Hypertension* showed that daily consumption of watermelon improved arterial function by enabling blood vessel dilation*.
- * The amino acid L-citrulline in the juice converts to arginine which is also beneficial in ameliorating this cardiovascular dysfunction.

Watermelon juice significantly improves metabolic syndrome in diabetics, by improving glycaemic


