PRESIDENT GREG'S UPDATE

24 September 2020

At our Board Meeting last Monday, our great achievements to date were noted, especially:

- Pursuing three more distant Projects one for <u>Hearing Research</u> in Darwin, a second being sending support to Vanuatu post cyclone and the third being <u>Shipping Medical equipment ex DIK to Sri</u> <u>Lanka.</u>

It was indeed gratifying for some of us to attend a Rotary Business Breakfast by Zoom the next morning (Tuesday) where the CEO of Minter Ellison, Annette Kimmett summarised their focus during Covid as:

- 1. Maintaining Financial Viability
- 2. Maintenance of the Health/Welfare of their 3000 employees, including medical support.
- 3. Doing everything to stay connected to Clients e.g. walking/fun
- 4. How do we operate during easing of restrictions e.g. electronic considerations and staying flexible
- 5. What Strategic steps do they take toward 'New Normal'?

I am not too bold to suggest that Annette has been listening to our Board meetings as Minter Ellison areas of focus align with what we talked about on Monday!!! It all makes good, logical sense, for which I am thankful.
