

and spent time on the ropes course, and had a dress up disco/music night.





oonee Valley Council's Youth Fest on 22 September was the perfect opportunity for the launch of a new car donated to the L2P Program by Flemington Kensington Rotary.

In brilliant sunshine, Rotary District supported people to obtain Governor Ron Payne joined President Shraddha Sharma, members of Flemington Kensington Rotary and Moonee Valley council representatives to celebrate the new car.

Ron and Shraddha expressed their delight at this opportunity for Rotary to support young people who were unable to obtain the required supervised driving hours.

Education and supporting young people are key pillars of the work being done by Rotary in the community and Flemington Kensington Rotary contributes thousands of dollars annually through scholarships, sponsorships and material support in the Flemington, Kensington and Ascot Vale communities.

Mayor Pierce Tyson was accompanied by Cr Rose Iser, L2P Coordinator Emma Phillips and performed the formal ribbon cutting alongside DG Ron and President Shraddha. The car, a Kia Rio, proudly wears the Rotary Flemington Kensington branding along with L2P and Moonee Valley Council. It will be based at the Ascot Vale Leisure Centre and joins the existing vehicle which is housed at Moonee Ponds Police Station.

Flemington Kensington Rotary began their involvement with learner/migrant drivers in 2013 when they initiated the RoadStart program in conjunction with VicRoads and the Victorian Government. This project supported people to obtain the required hours of supervised driving through volunteer mentors. In 2015, the program became DriveLink managed by council.

The funds for this donation were raised during 2013 when the club participated in a large number of sausage sizzles for the Metro Rail Link upgrade where a breakfast BBQ fruit and drinks were provided for commuters being bussed from the Werribee line to Flemington racecourse. Members ran these BBQs at Flemington racecourse and Sunshing railways stations throughout the year.

Mentor drivers are needed and Emma
Phillips is keen to source volunteers from
the Flemington and Ascot Vale areas. A
commitment of just 2 hours weekly will assist a
young person obtain their licence and help with
their education and employment opportunities.


INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY: MOONEE VALLEY COUNCIL

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID







- The aim of this second program funded by us was to meet a need identified at our Mental Health forum in 2022. Many women from Horn of Africa backgrounds articulated their distress at being unable to support their children and community experiencing mental health issues. They were also unable to commit to 2 full days due to childminding duties.
- The solution: run the program over 4 half days in school hours, AND find a presentr with cultural and linguistic awareness.



Dr Francis Aquah, a Rotarian from Greensborough was able to meet our requirements so the program ran over 4 days at Djerring Hub.

The District Foundation supported the additional costs with a grant.
 21 participants graduated!





1,000 STORIES PROJECT



Members continued to support this project which collects picture storybooks for

disadvantaged children.

 These are distributed through our 2 local maternal & child health centres: Wingate Avenue and Hopetoun Avenue Our tally to date is in excess of 8,000 books over 5 years!







THE 1000 STORIES PROJECT

Providing books for children 3 months to 5 years from disadvantaged and refugee backgrounds in the Ascot Vale, Flemington & Kensington area, through Maternal & Child Health Nurse visits.



For many of these children, books in the home are rare; and results in them starting school without the recommended 1,000 Books before school or 5,000-word vocabulary identified as a necessary learning base

STROKE BEDS FOR SRI LANKA







PP Peter Cribb received a request from Dr Harsha Gunasekara, Consultant Neurologist at the Sri Jayewardenepura General Hospital through our friends at the Rotary Club of Colombo. The treatment and care of people suffering from stroke was a challenge – could Rotary help?

Through Rotary Donations in Kind West Footscray and RARE in South Australia, this has now been achieved. A donation from the Australian Sri Lankan Association of SA, a private donor and our club hs now seen 2 containers filled with hospital beds and other medical equipment shipped.

50 beds and mattresses, patient transfer trolleys, medication cabinets, wheelchairs and walkers, blankets

and llinen, gowns, blood pressure machine etc









ESTABLISHING LIBRARIES IN THE MALDIVES



While visiting Sri Lanka and the Maldives in March, PP Peter Cribb was asked if we could help with books and libraries in remote atolls of the Maldives. The High Commissioner to the Maldives had some funds to use by the end of June. Could we help?

Through Rotary Donations in Kind West Footscray and a private donor, Robert Akeroyd, Peter and a team of Rotarians collected 5 pallets of books which were then sorted, repacked and loaded. Dik donated another 4 pallets of children's books, and a pallet of student/school stationery.

Through a Rotarian connection, these 10 pallets were shipped as part of a container via airfreight from Tullamarine early in June.









MEDICAL SUPPLES TO JARRIBAN, PUNTLAND





Abdi Hassan and Mohammed Abbas Omar approached the club for help in sending hospital and medical equipment to Jarriban University Hospital in Puntland state, Somalia.


A long and difficult process ensued with many legal and logistical challenges, however, the goods are now ready for shipping. We waited for dialysis machines donated by the Austin Hospital. The container will have 20+ beds, 2 dialysis machines and chairs, 6 medication trolleys filled with bandages, gauze and consumables, patient transfer trolleys etc.



Members of the community raised \$10,000 towards shipping. A District Foundation grant has been received while the club will contribute the balance. Shipping to Africa is VERY expensive.







IMPACT:

In this financial year, we have donated \$70,083 to our local community, projects, scholarships and youth programs.

The impact is measured through Rotary Showcase, our website, newsletters and Facebook posts and through local media.

REACH:

We connect with councils, community and business organisations, schools and social welfare groups. We extend our reach through regular articles in local newspapers.

ENGAGEMENT:

Our members, volunteers and community connections are involved, active and listened to. We engage with council teams, community groups and the trader's association to partner and share our work.

We have modified our meetings, meeting schedules and projects to meet the needs of our members and community.
