We have a symbiotic partnership with the Op Shop for excess goods, unsuitable items


and rags. Larry Robb from Rotary North Melbourne collects excess

BACK TO SCHOOL EDUCATION: NEPAL



This project is supported by a Global Grant and a grant from the Balwyn Centenary Grants program.i It is being managed by the Rotary Club of Tripureswor and 3 NGOs.

The project aims to return to school, children who have dropped out of school, particularly girls. Literacy rates are low and the numbers of children completing secondary education is very low. These are marginialised and low socio economic communities.

Abdi Hassan and Mohammed Abbas Omar approached the club for help in sending hospital and medical equipment to Jarriban University Hospital in Puntland state, Somalia.

A long and difficult process ensued with many legal and logistical challenges, however, the container shipped 27 August and arrived in Jarriban 27 March 2025.

Members of the community raised \$10,000 towards shipping. strict Foundation grant has been received while the club will contribute the balance.



The Rotary Club of Flemington Kensington, Vic. recently presented a successful Mental Health First Aid program to address mental health concerns in its local community.

MEMBERS of the Rotary Club often spending many years of Flemington Kensington, Vic, were well aware of the challenges facing residents of the social housing estate in the area, having worked with and supported them for many years.

Most residents are refugees from the Horn of Africa diaspora and experienced trauma due to district grant, the club set about organising a Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) program. Moonee Valley Council offered their facility at the Djerring Hub, with a large and airy classroon containing audio visual facilities.

Understanding the background of participants was crucial to the success o the program, so a culturally sensitive and linguistically capable presenter was a priority. Dr Francis Aquah OAM, of the Rotary Club of Greensborough, Vic, was selected and agreed to moderate the program

As most of the participants were mothers, the program was altered to run over four days during school hours full days. Childcare was

Collaborating to support stroke victims in Sri Lanka

The Rotary Club of Flemington Kensington, Vic, has partnered with the Rotary Club of Colombo, Sri Lanka, the Australian Sri Lankan Association South Australia, Rotary Australia Repurposing Equipment and Rotary Donations in Kind to outfit stroke units in nine hospitals in Sri Lanka.

SRI LANKA has a very high incidence of stroke vet just 74 dedicated stroke beds the whole country. Access

to a stroke unit is possible for about 14 per cent of sufferers - in high income countries it is 91 per cent


