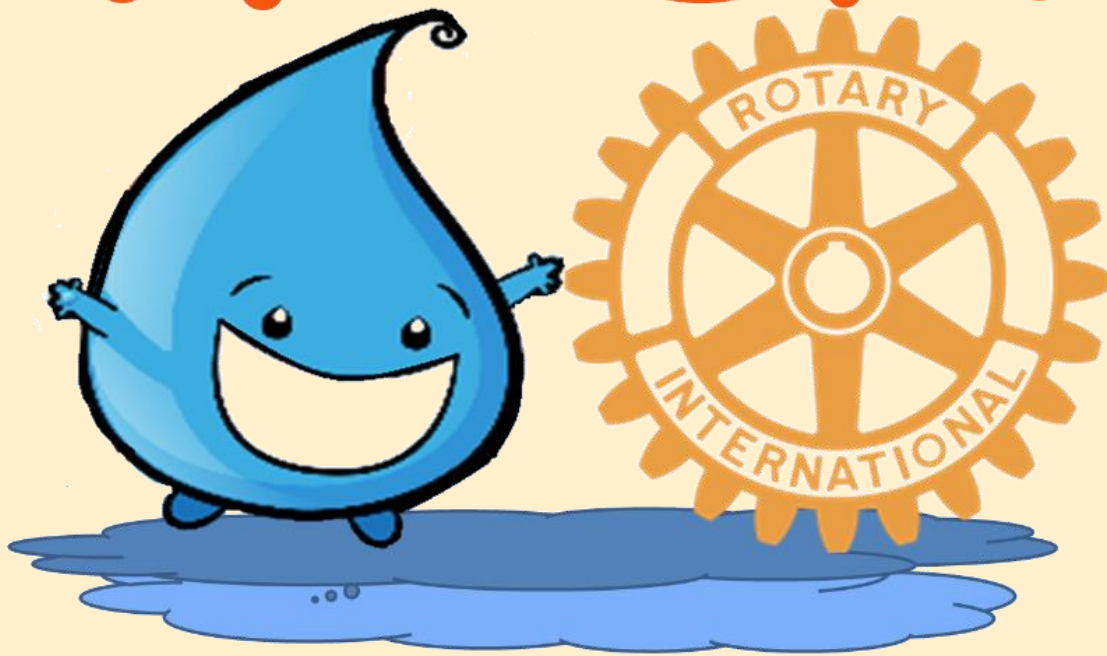

THE HYGIENE CLUB





What is the Hygiene Club?

We have a Hygiene Club because we are proud of our toilet blocks and want to keep them clean, safe and ready to use at all times. The Hygiene Club is led by a teacher and is made up of volunteer students who promise to make sure that the toilets are clean and that there is always water and soap available for flushing the toilets and washing our hands. The Hygiene Club will also make sure that all students know what to do when they go to the toilet to keep them clean and safe.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HYGIENE CLUB

To keep our toilets clean and to make sure that there is always water and soap available for our students to use, to wash themselves and to keep the toilets nice and clean.



1. Under the supervision of a teacher, visit the toilets three times a day for maintenance:
 - i. Before school starts
 - ii. At lunchtime
 - iii. At the end of the school day
2. Refill the 240-litre drum from water in the water tanks using the 20-litre jerry can.
3. Refill the buckets in each stall and the urinal chamber
4. Refill the Veronica buckets
5. Scrub the pans with the toilet brushes and rinse
6. Replenish the soap dispensers
7. Lock away the buckets, toilet brushes and small movable items in one of the stalls every evening.
8. Help make all students aware of what they should do when they go to the toilet (flush, replenish and wash hands).
9. Help with WASH training sessions for the whole school every three months.



How is the Hygiene Club Organised?

- One teacher to volunteer to lead the Hygiene Club – the Hygiene Club Champion.
- All teachers to rotate on a weekly roster to supervise the Hygiene Club shifts.
- Students volunteer to be a member of the Hygiene Club
- Student volunteers to be rostered for duty on a weekly basis on a cyclical roster
- Each weekly roster to have six students, three boys to look after the Boys Toilet and three girls to look after the Girls Toilet.
- The Hygiene Club members on duty will visit the toilets three times a day to:
 - Wash and rinse the toilet pans and urinals
 - Refill the buckets in each stall and in the urinal chamber from the 240-litre drum
 - Refill the 240-litre drum from the water tank using the jerry can
 - Refill the Veronica buckets
 - Replenish the soap supplies near the water tank tap
- Each student will be provided with a certificate of membership of the Hygiene Club.

WHY DO WE INVOLVE OUR STUDENTS IN THE HYGIENE CLUB?

The engagement of students in the Hygiene Club is essential for the success of the WASH program -Water Sanitation and Hygiene:

- To encourage a sense of ownership and pride.
- To encourage commitment to cleanliness and hygiene.
- To spread knowledge about the importance of washing your hands and keeping the toilets clean.
- To ensure the sustainability of the toilet buildings and facilities.



Things we need for clean hands and clean toilets
