Heather started volunteering with Special Olympics at age 11 and it has been a passion ever since. "The Special Olympics participants are athletes," says Heather, "and the competitions building social skills as well as provide camaraderie, a sense of family, and the best thing ever...smiles, excitement and fun!" Funds raised for Special Olympics Golf will be used to help fund the monthly tournament green fees, travel, supplies and gear.
