She is missing the teaching skills of Noela Phillips, under whose tutelage Ayan's English improved enormously whilst in hospital, to the point she could read most of the cards and letters sent to her. However, she is enjoying being out of hospital, the skin graft is fading slowly, and she is vigorously using the jaw exerciser kindly donated by Kate and George Hadgelias. Her diet has almost returned to normal.

Thanks again to Suad and Abdi Ismail who are billeting Ayan for the last week of her stay in Australia, assisted by local members of the Somaliland expat community. Ayan has visited the Gold Coast including the Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary.

Edna has now returned to her hospital in Somaliland, and installed the skin graft dermatome and mesher (see <a href="www.ozmedix.com.au/mgxroot/page 10769.html">www.ozmedix.com.au/mgxroot/page 10769.html</a>) for the benefit of the many burns cases seen there. It was purchased with funds raised at the two functions.
