Also that the basic tenets of Rotary are rooted in tolerance and understanding of others who might hold different ideals than our own. It's the ability to recognize these diverse opinions and work through those assorted distinctions that makes Rotary unique in the world.

INTERNATIONAL TOAST



Message from Edna

'A home without a mother is like a desert' ~ Somali Proverb

Our best wishes to all mothers today wherever they may be because in Hargeisa, Somaliland, we celebrate and honour all mothers. It's already been an eventful year for Edna Adan and the Edna Adan University Hospital - and it got even more remarkable when, yesterday, our friend New York Times columnist Nicholas Kristof recommended support of Edna Hospital as a fitting way to honour the girls still missing in Nigeria: <u>Honouring the Missing Schoolgirls</u>.

With sheer excitement, the hospital recently celebrated its 12th Anniversary and, at the same time, graduated 254 students. This was the last set of graduates to receive certificates and diplomas. However, the degree programs within the Hospital itself, continues as always.

Edna Adan University Hospital has made great strides to address the country's shortfall of health workers. Edna has trained over 300 midwives and nurses, and just this past month the hospital expanded the

<u>Community Midwife Training Program</u>. Edna's program has received the full backing of the Ministry of Health, Ministry of



Education, along with many small rural villages and towns. A total of 40 students will be participating in the two-year training program, which will take place in the neighbouring towns of Berbera and Gabiley. The Community Midwife program will continue to expand until the country reaches 1000 midwives.

University of Pennsylvania

Edna is pleased to be a participant in University of Pennsylvania's ceremonial events. On May 15th, Edna will be the recipient of the <u>Renfield Award for Global Women's Health</u>, and on the 19th, Edna will be honoured with a Doctor of Sciences degree for her role in improving health conditions, reducing the rates of maternal and infant mortality, and providing health care for thousands of women and children.
