In 1971 Jenny was a Rotary Exchange student in Oklahoma where she stayed with a family involved in setting up the polio eradication project in Rotary. Her "Rotary Dad" had a plaque presented to him for the work he did on this project. This was Jenny's first introduction to polio. Since then she has gone on to do amazing work through Rotary in eradicating polio. Recently her "Rotary Dad" passed away and bequeathed the statue to her in recognition of the great work she has done. A very touching moment!!
