


Rotary Club of Brisbane High-Rise

Whilst the world was focused on Brisbane for G20 over the last week, there were a couple of local projects I had the honour to attend that symbolise how Rotary continues to make the world a better place.

Several of us joined over 100 people last Thursday morning to celebrate the completion of the Rotary Club of Brisbane Planetarium's "Project Now". This newly completed building is a residence for women recovering from addiction and who are undertaking a program run by the Salvation Army. This has nearly doubled the number of beds available to women in SE Qld. For a club that usually raised \$40,000 a year, spurred on by an initial pledge of \$250,000, they raised \$750,000 in just 3 years. It just shows what can be done with self-belief and the passion to make something a reality. Congratulations to Planetarium for their extraordinary outcome.

On Wednesday night I witnessed another example of how a simple project initiated by a single Rotary Club, in this case Mitchell River in country Victoria in 1997, can been embraced by other clubs worldwide. I had the privilege to attend the Rotary Junior Community Awards, run by the Rotary Club of Toowong. This is a project based program that helps students gain an insight into how their local community operates and provides them with an opportunity to gain leadership skills. Awards were presented to over 50 year 6 & 7 students, from 5 local primary schools, who successfully completed the tasks required (with John McGinley's daughter, Isabella, one of the very proud and deserved recipients). After being blown away by the high calibre of the speeches on the night by a rep from each school (11 and 12 years olds!!), all I can say is "our future is in very good hands".
