



This was our first connection with the amazing Edna Adan Ismail and the hospital she has created. Since then we have been able to send to Edna a number of items of medical equipment. This Thursday's breakfast speaker will be Dr Rod Thelander, a Rotarian from Perth, talking about the great work the organisation Australian Doctors for Africa do and how they have worked closely with Edna and her hospital in Somaliland for many years. With some of our members heading to visit Edna's hospital next January, it will great to hear more about what they will expect to witness first hand.

In 2007, ROMAC brought Roselyn Higana from the Philippines for what transpired to be an extremely lengthy medical case. Roselyn returned in 2011 for some follow up procedures and is now out again this week for what our own senior surgeon, Dr John Arvier, describes as minor surgery. One thing I am proud of our club is that we have supported the accompaniment of patients like Roselyn (and Ayan from Somaliland) by local doctors so they can enhance the services available in their homeland. Hence I look forward to meeting again on Thursday morning the doctor who has accompanied Roselyn on her 3 visits, Dr Gaye Ardanas.

And in a week where our focus appears to be on all things medical, Friday the 24th is World Polio Day!! This is reminder of the extraordinary commitment Rotary International has embarked on to rid polio from our planet and is now so close (99%) to ending it once and for all.
