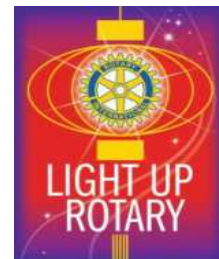

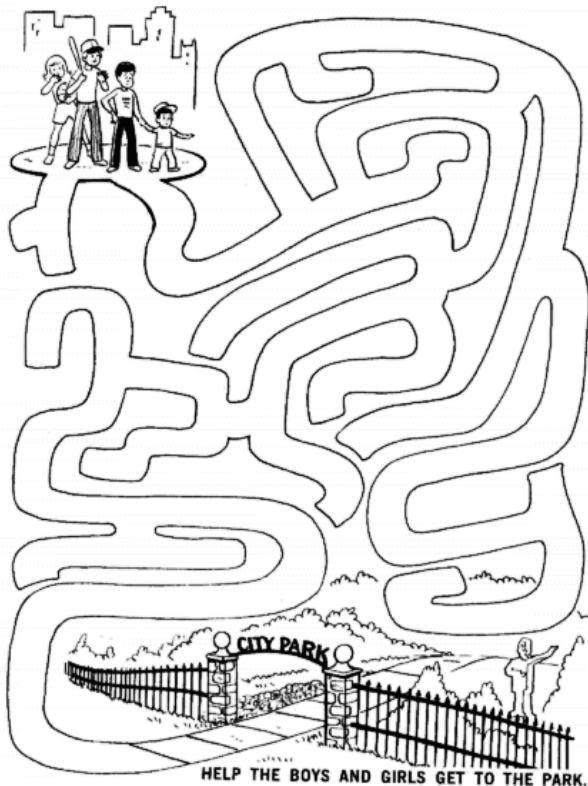


Paul Harris Fellow

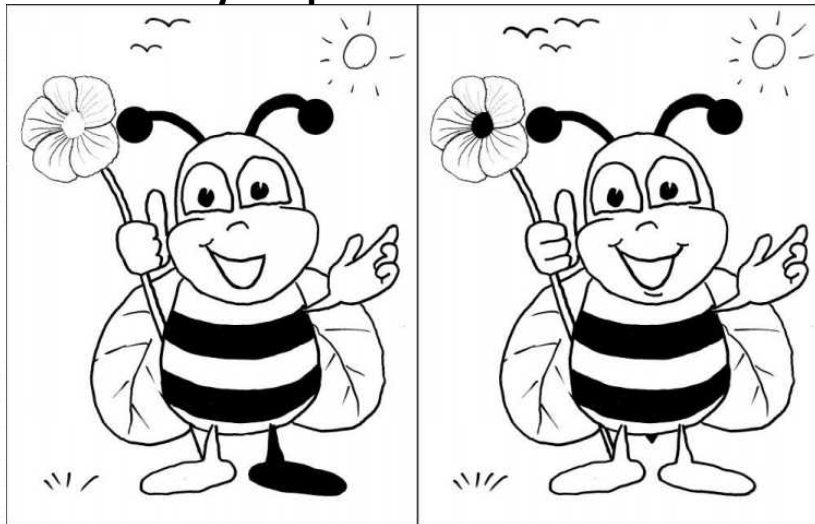

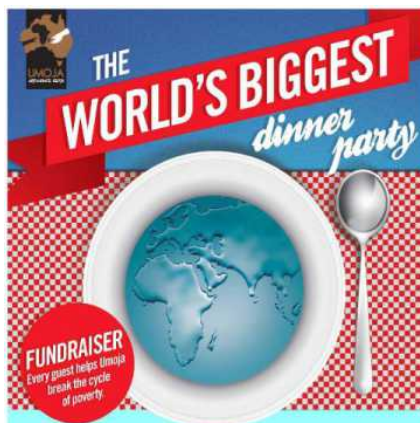
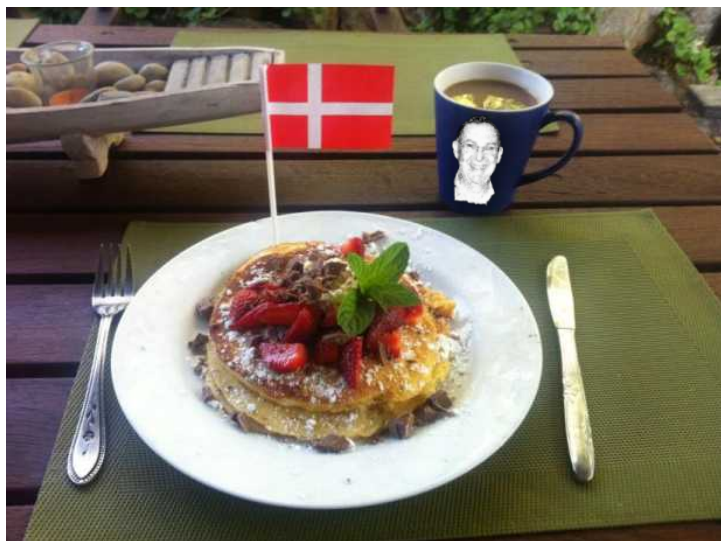
