Did you know that Rotary, was the world's first service club, founded on 23 February 1905 when Chicago lawyer Paul Harris and three friends met in a small downtown office. They were seeking that spirit of friendliness they had known in their small home towns. Word soon spread, others join in and the club was formed. They named their new club "Rotary" to describe the practice of meeting in rotation at the members' various places of business. Originally formed for fellowship, that first Rotary club quickly evolved to use the talents and resources of its members to serve the community.
