



BACK IN EUROPE

We are doing a tour through the Baltic States from St Petersburg in Russia to Krakow in Poland with a few days in London to get over the jet lag. On previous trips, I have tried to have a theme through the pictures. Previously I've done London Monopoly, and Clocks. This time it's "How we Travel". #1. Our flight from Australia we travelled on Malaysian Airlines. A highlight is the appetiser of satay sticks they serve before dinner. Other airlines do it as well, but I think these are the best. #2. The Staybridge Suites hotel we regularly go back to, I thought I'd have a couple of photos of our room. #3. Why is it that it seems like every time we go to London the weather turns bad. No different this time. The rain starts. Nevertheless we brave the elements and do one of the excellent London Walks. If you ever do have free time in London I can highly recommend them. Today's tour took us around the Clerkenwell district. This includes St Bart's hospital, the oldest in Britain having been founded in 1123. In front of the hospital is an area where William Wallace was executed, as were several other religious martyrs during the reigns of the Tudors in the 1500s. Also Smithfield market, the Order of St John, and the Marx Memorial Library. (That's Karl not Groucho). The Crown Tavern across the street from the library is supposedly the place where Lenin first met Stalin in 1905. Some historians dispute this. Nevertheless, Lenin certainly lived and worked in this area. #4. A morning walk around Charterhouse Square. The original buildings are still there from the 1300s when it was a priory. Dissolved by Henry VIII, it became a school and alms house in 1611. Charterhouse School moved from this site in 1872 to Surrey, where it is now. Robert Baden Powell was a pupil here at the time of the move. Also on the Square is this building. Do you recognise it? That's a quiz for you. Tomorrow we have an early morning flight to St Petersburg.
