Form 4 Graduation at St Jude's

On Saturday 10 October 2020 the St Jude's Girls' Secondary School at Sisia Campus hosted their Form 4 Celebration and Awards Day. The Form 4 students were joined by their families, academic and non-academic staff and school leaders for the colourful celebration. In true Tanzanian fashion, there was plenty of singing, dancing and entertaining speeches – a celebration to remember! Completing the final year of ordinary level studies (O Levels) is an impressive milestone in the life of any young adult. While 90% of Tanzanian students between the ages of seven and 13 are enrolled in primary school, only 35% of 14 to 19 year old students are enrolled in secondary school. The current Form 4 students, together with other students across the country, are about to sit the Form 4 National Examinations. The results of these examinations are likely to be released by the government in late February 2021 (it varies slightly every year). After that, the current students whose results meet St Jude's academic requirements for being considered for a further scholarship will make the decision whether they wish to submit an application for an advanced level (A Level) scholarship. Their next step is to sit the A level entrance exam alongside the high performing government students similarly invited to do so.

It will then be a bit of a wait while we process the entrance examination results, make the scholarship offers, and receive the acceptance confirmations. Sometimes students don't make this decision until right before they are due to start the new academic year in July. This means we often don't know who is continuing onto A Levels at St Jude's until late July. Sponsors will be notified by the end of March if their Form 4 Graduate has not been offered a further scholarship to St Jude's. Below are graduation pictures of Lightness Jonas, who is jointly sponsored by John and Louise Arvier and the Tillmanns. Lightness has cerebral palsy which has affected her speech and hands, but it has not stopped her from achieving great academic results. Lightness types, writes and paints with her feet. Many of our members have met Lightness when visiting St Jude's and it is great to see her so happy at her Grade 4 Graduation.
