GOODBYE TO A GREAT ROTARIAN

Last week we said goodbye to ninety-twoyear-old Len Rix who finished his Rotary career as an honorary member of Brisbane High Rise Rotary Club. Len had been with us for 3 years after moving to Brisbane from Ballina to be closer to his family.

Len joined Ballina Rotary Club in September 1972 & in his 50 years of Rotary service, he undertook all roles on the board of his Club. He held a Paul Harris Fellowship (plus Sapphire) & had been President twice.

Len was a great supporter of youth in Rotary, hosting teams participating in group study exchange and, with his wife Margaret, was a counsellor to Rotary Exchange students in their district. Len was also instrumental in assisting our own Craig Wappett to achieve an Ambassadorial Scholarship to study in the USA. Len was on a District Committee for FAIM (now RAWKS) and supported Rotary Exchange by encouraging his 2 children, Susan & Paul to be Rotary Exchange students. Susan went on to become one of the founding members of our Club, a position which pleased her father greatly & led him to spend his last Rotary years with our Club.

He will be remembered by the Rotary family as, not only an impressive member but a kind mentor to those who were seeking direction.

He will be sadly missed by us all.

Ashton Wood zoomed in to give us a very inspirational talk about his project DV Safephone which he administers from Caloundra on the Sunshine Coast. Ashton & his team repair old mobile phones to be made as new for the use of victims of domestic violence.

According to Ashton, many victims have their phones confiscated or damaged by the perpetrators of DV so that their means of getting help or communicating is impossible.

Ashton's repaired phones are distributed to Emergency

Service Organisations & the Police. Victims are then able to access the help needed for their survival. No money changes hands, so DV Safephone is dependent on the charity of others. You can access their website on <u>dvsafephone.org</u> if you would like to help their cause.

Our Club has committed to gather as many (Finished – With) phones from members & their friends & families on **10 November** when John & I will gather them & transport them to Ashton in Caloundra.


