1 INTERNATIONAL TOAST



Today we toast the Rotary Club of Bogotá Capital - Colombia. The club meets every Monday at 7:30 PM. The club helps Altos de la Estancia area of Ciudad Bolívar, a poverty-stricken district, with a food donation campaign.

The endeavor was planned to benefit farmers outside the city as well as people in the neighborhood. They collected funds and bought fruits and vegetables from 10 farming families. The food was distributed to 346 families by Sineambore, a local organic waste recycler, which also provided organic fertilizer to the farmers in the network.

FROM THE PRESIDENT – BARBARA LEDDY

Peter Haenke an Investment Manager with ARENA (Australian Renewable Energy Agency) spoke to the club on Australia's decarbonisation journey: Challenges and Opportunities with specific reference to ARENA's role in R&D and deployment of new technologies.

Of interest is that on an annual basis renewable energy is over 30% of Australia's electricity supply now and has doubled in the last 5 years with a trajectory of 100% of all electricity generation somewhere between 2030 and 2050 depending on the development of Hydrogen power.

Peter spoke about this as akin to a new Industrial Revolution and the great opportunity for Australia to take advantage of renewables given our natural and human resources.

Part of the future predicts new jobs of between 212k to 4461k, but with a need for \$53-100 billion of new investment that could abate 70 Mt CO2 equivalent.

ARENA'S portfolio of investment includes

- Optimising the transition to renewable electricity
- Commercialisation of clean hydrogen
- Support the transition to low emissions metals (iron ore and alumina as examples) and

 Decarbonise land transport through electric vehicles. This is a big new area of investment and technology for Australia and the talk was well received. Perhaps an annual update from Peter may be of use?

This articulate overview was supplied by Peter's cousin, our Tom Davison, who kindly offered to decipher Peter's message in a much more professional manner than that which I was able. He has also supplied me with a visual representation of Peter's talk which I will send to you electronically. Thank you heaps, Tom

A couple of future events I wish to draw attention to are Noela Phillip's presentation on Tanzania this week & our Melbourne Cup celebration on October 27.

Noela's talk will have great relevance to those participating in the Club tour early next year & will be a refreshing update for those return travellers who know & love the Country.

Our work in Tanzania is a hallmark of the dedication of our Club to support & improve the education of children & support families in thirdworld nations.

Hamlin College of Midwives Class of 2022

At the end of July, we celebrated the graduation of 16 impressive young women from the Hamlin College of Midwives. Each had studied a four-year Bachelor of Science degree in Midwifery and will now spend at least another four years working in Hamlin-supported midwifery clinics, preventing obstetric fistula and saving lives. To date 234 midwives have graduated from Hamlin College of Midwives and have gone on to work in one of 94 Hamlin-supported midwifery clinics. This level of study is all thanks to scholarships provided by donors like you!



Beza Gebremichael - Top of the class

"Midwives are important. During my clinical practice there was a mother who was bleeding severely. She was so pale and unconscious but after management she survived. I was very happy to see that.

After graduating, I am excited that I will be posted to my family's community in SNNPR in Southwestern Ethiopia. It gives me satisfaction because serving them feels like paying them back for what they did for me."



Mastewal Andualem - Second in the class

"Midwives; they save the life of both the mother and the baby. Now I am graduating, I am happy because I too will save lives.

I'll be working in the Amhara region where my family is from. I understand the language, culture, and beliefs of the community. Therefore, I can solve their problems accordingly. I am excited to begin my career as a midwife there."



Mulu Kassaw - Third in the class

"I decided I wanted to become a midwife before I was seven years old. My Aunt was a graduate by this profession.

"The parts of this job I will enjoy the most are attending delivery and giving family planning service. I am being posted to a Hamlin-supported midwifery clinic in the Amhara region, close to my family. I am happy that I will be of service to the women in my community."



Etsegenet Wudneh - managed 108 deliveries!

(Australian BSc Midwifery graduates have managed a minimum of 30 'normal births' by the time they graduate)

"I'm very happy I have graduated because now I can help rural area mothers. I will be working in a Hamlin midwifery clinic in SNNPR near to my family home and community.

The midwifery profession is a gift of God. Not all people can be a midwife. If you are gifted, be a midwife and be empathetic."

Thanks to the amazing fundraising by RideWest, we are in a position to recruit an additional mental health clinician to our Outback Mental Health team.

Dr Tim Driscoll is currently recruiting for a new position based in Charleville, with the role recently being advertised. The core focus of this new role will be:

 Providing one-on-one clinical service to key communities that have a need for additional mental health support; Augathella, Tambo, Blackhall and Mitchell

Delivering mental health education across southwest Queensland—including community workshops and mental health first aid training

As you know, people living in remote, rural and regional Australia are almost twice as likely to die from suicide. A significant contributing factor to this tragic statistic is a lack of access to mental health services because of isolation, cost and limited local mental health professionals.

Wellbeing Out West aims to address this lack of access by directly supporting communities with mental health services and increasing community capacity to support each other through mental health training.

I am extremely grateful to you both, the RideWest board and sponsors, the support team, and of course—all the riders! Every day, I feel grateful to be part of a service that is trusted by the communities we serve and is there to support families and communities during some of their hardest times. But we are only able to be there because of our supporters. Thank you.

Highlights from the recently concluded RYLA 2022, through the direction of **Kym McCluskey, District 9620 RYLA Chair 2022**

Last week 29 RYLArians, 6 Alumni Leaders and 5 Coaches left behind everyday life to be fully immersed in RYLA 2022. The RYLArians were challenged to step outside their comfort zone, be inspired, learn a lot about themselves (and others) and think big! There was a balance of thinking time and doing time as well as loads of fun to allow them to experience all of the things that define a great leader.

A primary theme that carried across the week was "it doesn't matter how big or small your idea seems, if you're willing to back it, you can take it anywhere". We heard from a number of inspirational speakers including our own Bill Phillips (Mamba), Ashton Woods (DV Safe Phones), Sarah Cowley (UNICEF) and Maddie Kelly (School of St Judes) who spoke about the impact they

have made to the lives of others, by backing their idea.

To underpin this theme, 6 teams of RYLArians came up with an idea for their own project to support a Rotary focus area and create a big social impact. The ideas were innovative and showcased the caliber of emerging leaders within our Rotary family. Setting out in February this year, it has been quite a journey to bring the new District 9620 program to life. I enlisted the help of 4 amazing friends, with specialities in innovation, program management, emotional intelligence, leadership and facilitation to rewrite the program. They volunteered their time to help design the program, write their individual sessions and relocate to Tuchekoi for a week to deliver RYLA 2022. We were supported by a team of 6 Alumni leaders (including High-Rise sponsored Jimmy Postle) who uplifted the program through experiences and activities that strengthened leadership concepts, while having a lot of fun.

And a big thanks to the High-Rise team for your support - Wendy, Andrew and Bill all came to present.

It's very humbling to think about how Rotary has helped to change lives, not only through teaching young adults new skills but also living Rotary values of inclusion, support and helping others. The participants rated RYLA 4.8 out of 5 overall - a fabulous result for a fabulous week.




